

Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



"Without the Resurrection, the Cross is only tragic defeat; without the Cross, the Resurrection is only a romantic dream of life without end." - Philip H. Pfatteicher

This newsletter will presumably find you sometime during the first week of March, but I wanted to take a moment and look at the last week of this month, the week we call Holy Week. Each day is a piece of the story, our story, and each day builds on the others.

<u>March 25th - Palm Sunday:</u> We stand on the steps of the narthex, we wave our palm crosses, we reenact the parade of the citizens who shouted praises of "Hosanna, Hosanna!" But, those cheers of celebration quickly turn into jeers of disgust, and those palms were burned down to make the ashes that covered our foreheads at the beginning of this Lenten journey. This is a day of fleeting celebration.

<u>March 29th - Maundy Thursday:</u> This night is the beginning of the end it seems. On this night we remember the final meal that Jesus had with his disciples and we participate in that meal along with the whole company of saints who have gone before us. On this night we remember Christ's humility when he, the suffering servant, lowered himself to wash the feet of his disciples. And on this night we remember his mandate that we are called to live as people of faith, "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."

<u>March 30th - Good Friday:</u> Today is the day the Lord died. Today is the day we nailed Christ to his Cross. Today is the day that we shared in with crowd of people and turned our praises of "Hosanna" into vile shouts of "Crucify him, Crucify him!" Today is the day that the heavens were torn in two. Today is the day Jesus forgave the thief on the cross. Today is the day that Christ destroyed all of our sin, not by a glorious victory but by a disgraceful death. This is the day the Lord died.

<u>March 31st - The Day of Waiting:</u> On this day we have no worship service at Emanuel, we have no celebration, no hymns, no prayers. This is the liminal time, after the devastation of the crucifixion but before the joy of the resurrection. This is the great day of anticipation.

<u>April 1st - Easter Sunday:</u> Early in the morning, Peter and Mary and the other disciples arrive at the grave to find something more remarkable than Jesus' miracles, more moving than his preaching to the multitudes, more shocking than his claim to be the Son of God...they found the tomb empty! This is what we have been waiting for, this is what all of Christ's teaching and preaching have lead up to. This is why we gather week after week as resurrection people. Today is the day that Christ, who has already conquered and forgiven all our sin, now turns towards death and says, "No! For me and my beloved, death does not get the final word." This is the day of promise; this is the day of Good News.

COMMUNITY SHARING AND CARING OUTREACH:

LA HABRA COMMUNITY RESOURCE CARE CENTER & DANIEL ALVAREZ RECOVER CENTER: Receptacles are in the Narthex at all times for these ministries. Thanks to Marge Dalby and Andy Zambrano who faithfully deliver these gifts every month.

In addition, through our Good Samaritan Fund we assist the LHCRCC with emergency housing vouchers as the need arises within our community.

<u>MATTHEW 25 GRANT:</u> Emanuel wrote and submitted a grant application to the Pacifica Synod to support CityNet in La Habra. We have been awarded a grant of \$650.00. Our grant was specifically to participate in CityNet, La Habra, which works with our local first responders and other community agencies to prevent and address homelessness.

We are currently working with CityNet to determine how to best leverage this grant. Since we have learned the most at-risk population for homelessness is older women, we are devising a plan to focus on this vulnerable group.

One of the ways we can help is to volunteer at the Community Center to serve lunch at visit. Watch for more information soon.

FRISTERS: As in past years, we will be collecting diapers and wipes for the children of Fristers (KIDSTERS). Fristers is a ministry for young mothers to assist them in learning life skills, finishing school, and caring for their children. They meet weekly and each child who comes is cared for and receives diaper changes while their mothers are meeting. Please bring diapers and wipes to the Narthex or Moerer Hall by March 18 for delivery March 22. We have also received a generous monetary gift designated for Fristers which is being used to purchase 25 copies each of The Little Mouse, The Red Ripe Strawberry, The Big Hungry Bear, and 40 copies of Miss Bindergarten Gets Ready for Kindergarten.

<u>PATRIOTS & PAWS:</u> New or gently used kitchen items, small appliances, linens, dishes, flatware, small furniture items such as side tables and ottomans are needed to assist our returning vets to set up housekeeping. <u>Items will be collected on April 13 & 14 and transported to Patriots & Paws at 10:00AM on Saturday, April 14</u>. FRUIT LADYBUGS


Get creative in the kitchen with this sweet springtime snack.

What you need:

- Strawberries (washed)
- Knife
- Plate or wax paper
- ½ cup melted chocolate chips
- Zippered baggie
- Scissors
- Blueberries (washed)
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. De-stem the strawberries.
 Cut in half and then cut a small V atop each half to make the ladybug body.
 Set them on a plate or wax paper.
- 2. Place the melted chocolate in a baggie and cut off the tip of a bottom corner.
- 3. Pipe a dividing line and "spots" on each strawberry. Also use the chocolate to attach a blueberry "head" by the V shape.
- 4. Pipe chocolate antennas and legs onto ladybugs.
- 5. Let harden. Enjoy!
