

#### **Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr**



I am on the search for the perfect daily podcast devotion. I put that out there, in hopes that someone might have a suggestion for me. But you need to know that I have some criteria.

- 1. It must be a Podcast (audio file) devotion that I can download or subscribe to on my phone. I have plenty of devotional books, I'm looking for something to listen to, not something I read.
- 2. It must be good theology. There are lots of Christian podcasts out there that talk about how *I* can be a good Christian. I'm less interested in what *I* am up to and more interested in what *God* is up to.
- 3. It must capture my attention. I found a couple of podcasts that were great theological lectures but were BORING. That's not going to cut it in my search for the *perfect* daily devotional podcast.
- 4. It must be daily. Weekly and monthly are fine, but I need to be fed daily.
- 5. It needs to be less than 16 minutes long. The length of my morning commute is 16 minutes and this is when I want to listen to my devotion.

In attempts to find the perfect daily podcast devotion I have listened to a number of them. There are a few contenders but none that completely fit my criteria. One of the devotions I listened to (didn't fit criteria #4 and #5 hence did not make the cut) gave me food for thought. The pastor who put out this devotion was talking about the well known Bible verse from Psalm 46, "Be still and Know that I am God." This pastor went on to talk about how some of us in our churches are really good at making time *for* God but not at making time to *be with* God. He went on to distinguish the difference saying, "There are lots of people who will volunteer in their community out of a sense of mission from Christ, or they will do stuff around their church to promote and support the ministry done there. Many of us are much more likely to sign up for things we can do *for* God but not as likely to set that intentional time aside just to be *with* God."

How many of your are now thinking, "But I don't have time for that!!!"? I know I often do. The reason I want a devotion that I listen to in my car while I'm driving is that whenever I try to start a regular reading practice of devotion, I end up using my 'being still' time as 'how can I use this in God's service' time. In other words, whenever I start a devotion, I end up figuring out how I can use what I have gleaned in a sermon, Bible Study or as is shown here, in a newsletter article. If I am listening while I am driving, I can't stop to highlight something or jot down a note, I just have to listen to be with God. There is nothing wrong with wanting to share what we have with the world, that is what our Lord ask of us. BUT, he also asks us to come and be present with him. Put down our to-do lists and listen to him.

What would it look like if we were as intentional at setting time aside to be still with God as we are about doing things for God? What if, along with asking people to sign up to help usher, bring snacks or sing in the choir, we also asked people to sign up for a half an hour of being still in God's presence? I pray that as I strive to make that a reality with my ongoing podcast saga, you would find the way to make that important time in your life for stillness in the presence of God.

#### **COMMUNITY SHARING AND CARING OUTREACH:**

**LA HABRA COMMUNITY RESOURCE CARE CENTER & DANIEL ALVAREZ RECOVER CENTER**: Receptacles are in the Narthex at all times for these ministries. Thanks to Marge Dalby and Andy Zambrano who faithfully deliver these gifts every month.

In addition, through our Good Samaritan Fund we assist the LHCRCC with emergency housing vouchers as the need arises within our community.

<u>MATTHEW 25 GRANT:</u> Emanuel wrote and submitted a grant application to the Pacifica Synod to support CityNet in La Habra. We have been awarded a grant of \$650.00. Our grant was specifically to participate in CityNet, La Habra, which works with our local first responders and other community agencies to prevent and address homelessness.

We are currently working with CityNet to determine how to best leverage this grant. Since we have learned the most at-risk population for homelessness is older women, we are devising a plan to focus on this vulnerable group. One of the ways we can help is to volunteer at the Community Center to serve lunch and visit. Watch for more information soon.

FRISTERS: As in past years, we collected diapers and wipes for the children of Fristers (KIDSTERS). Fristers is a ministry for young mothers to assist them in learning life skills, finishing school, and caring for their children. They meet weekly and each child who comes is cared for and receives diaper changes while their mothers are meeting. Thanks to Janine Ward and Marge Glauch for making the delivery on March 22. Picture to follow. We have also received a generous monetary gift designated for Fristers which was used to purchase 25 copies each of The Little Mouse, The Red Ripe Strawberry, The Big Hungry Bear, and 40 copies of Miss Bindergarten Gets Ready for Kindergarten. In addition, we delivered some very special wool baby socks from Minnesota.




#### WINGS SHELTER PAJAMA PARTY

## SCHOPPA SCHOLARSHIPS

The Elroy Schoppa Scholarship Fund is provided by Emanuel Lutheran Church for scholarships to members of Emanuel, who are, or will be attending in the next academic year, an accredited college or vocational school.

To be eligible the student must attend approximately fifty percent (50%) of the Sunday worship services and fifty percent (50%) of the scheduled youth meetings for at least two years within four years of applying for this award. They must also maintain a grade point average of at least 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. In each subsequent year, for a maximum of four years, the recipient must provide a copy of their transcripts to continue the scholarship.

We currently have three recipients of Schoppa scholarships. **Erika Reyes**, attending Franklin University in Lugano, and **Jamie Whitcher**, attending Westmont College in Santa Barbara, are both in their fourth year of receiving Schoppa scholarships. **Jessica Mora**, attending Cal State Fullerton, is in her first year of receiving a Schoppa scholarship. 
## THRIVENT FINANCIAL FREE SHRED EVENT

#### What you need:

- Adult help
- Piece of wood
- 5 nails
- Hammer
- 2 balls of yarn (blue and yellow)

#### What you do:

- 1. Hammer the nails into the wood to form a cross shape (see example).
- 2. Tie the blue yarn to the bottom nail. Wrap it up and around the top nail and back down to the bottom nail. Then wrap it around the middle nail and around the side nails. Repeat until the yarn is wrapped about halfway up the exposed nails.
- 3. Repeat step two with the yellow yarn. Wrap it around the nails until only the heads are visible.
