

But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!" "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her." — Luke 10:40-42

We are an active church, just looking through this newsletter you can see that. We keep ourselves busy with the work of the Lord. In the Biblical story of Mary and Martha, Emanuel Lutheran Church tends to be the Martha. And I think that's a wonderful thing! God has blessed us with gifts to serve His Kingdom and I'm glad that we as a congregation work so hard to be examples of Christ in all that we do. But sometimes, SOMETIMES, we need to be the Mary of the Story. We need to slow ourselves down and sit at the foot of Christ and have our souls fed by Him. This month of May, we have several things happening at Emanuel that are set to focus on our spirituality and our connection with God.

The first weekend in May, we are holding our fourth annual Women's Retreat in Murrieta. While this event doesn't encompass all of the congregation, this year it will include twenty women. This is a weekend designed to give the women in attendance a time to rest, relax and be refreshed in the Lord. Because we are together the whole weekend and not just for an hour or two in Bible Study, it truly is a time when all the participants dig deeper into their faith and look at where they encounter Christ in their lives. It is truly a time where the Holy Spirit is let loose!

The next weekend, on Mother's Day, we are having multiple baptisms — five at the 9:00 AM service and two at the 10:45 AM service! It will certainly be a day of great celebration. This day, when seven people from adults to infants will be welcomed into the family of Christ through the sacrament of Baptism, it will certainly be a day to remember our own baptisms. I know many of you, like myself, do not remember our baptisms, but being washed in the waters of baptism is something that stays with us our entire lives.

Then on the following weekend, May 20, we will have nine students who have completed their two years of study who will be participating in the Affirmation of Baptism. These confirmation students remind us that it is important, not just in Jr. High School but throughout our lives, to take time to deeply examine our honest and intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. As these young people and their mentors will attest, to have a true relationship with God does not always mean things will go smoothly, but it does mean that you will never be alone.

I pray that during this month when many people of our church are reconnecting with God in very personal ways that you too would find the time to sit at the feet of Jesus and learn from Him.

COMMUNITY SHARING AND CARING OUTREACH:

LA HABRA COMMUNITY RESOURCE CARE CENTER & DANIEL ALVAREZ RECOVER CENTER: Receptacles are in the Narthex at all times for these ministries. Thanks to Marge Dalby and Andy Zambrano who faithfully deliver these gifts every month. In addition, through our Good Samaritan Fund we assist the LHCRCC with emergency housing vouchers as the need arises within our community.

<u>MATTHEW 25 GRANT:</u> Emanuel wrote and submitted a grant application to the Pacifica Synod to support CityNet in La Habra. We have been awarded a grant of \$650.00. Our grant was specifically to participate in CityNet, La Habra, which works with our local first responders and other community agencies to prevent and address homelessness. We are currently working with CityNet to determine how to best leverage this grant. Since we have learned the most at-risk population for homelessness is older women, we are devising a plan to focus on this vulnerable group. FRISTERS: As in past years, we collected diapers and wipes for the children of Fristers (KIDSTERS). Fristers is a ministry for young mothers to assist them in learning life skills, finishing school, and caring for their children. They meet weekly and each child who comes is cared for and receives diaper changes while their mothers are meeting. Thanks to Janine Ward and Marge Glauch for making the delivery on March 22.



Patriots & Paws: What a wonderful outpouring of gifts for our returning vets and their families through Patriots & Paws. Two trucks and a van delivered the items on Saturday, April 14. Donations included pillows, sheets, towels, vacuum cleaners, small appliances, dishes, suitcases, furniture, and special gifts of bowls and leashes for the "paws." Thanks to all who participated, collected and sorted, and delivered. Kerry and Jack Ospital, Mary Ann Carlson, and James, Carol, Logan and Rachel Crabb delivered the items to the P & P Warehouse in Orange. Some items went directly from our trucks to the vets in need. 
- Women's pajamas and sweats (sizes Large and Extra Large)


SPRING TALENT SHOW

JOY CIRCLE

SCHOPPA SCHOLARSHIPS

The Elroy Schoppa Scholarship Fund is provided by Emanuel Lutheran Church for scholarships to members of Emanuel, who are, or will be attending in the next academic year, an accredited college or vocational school.

To be eligible the student must attend approximately fifty percent (50%) of the Sunday worship services and fifty percent (50%) of the scheduled youth meetings for at least two years within four years of applying for this award. They must also maintain a grade point average of at least 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. In each subsequent year, for a maximum of four years, the recipient must provide a copy of their transcripts to continue the scholarship.

We currently have three recipients of Schoppa scholarships. **Erika Reyes**, attending Franklin University in Lugano, and **Jamie Whitcher**, attending Westmont College in Santa Barbara, are both in their fourth year of receiving Schoppa scholarships. **Jessica Mora**, attending Cal State Fullerton, is in her first year of receiving a Schoppa scholarship. NEW PROGRAM AT EMANUEL

Beginning this fall, we are expanding our Children's Ministry by offering a free afterschool tutoring program called "Study Buddies." This program will be totally run by volunteers and is open to children of the congregation and as an outreach to children in our surrounding neighborhood. It will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30-5:30 PM for children in grades 1 through 6.

BUT before we can do this, we need to know how many of you might be interested in giving two hours a week (pick either Tuesday or Thursday) to help a child get his/her homework done for the night! We can't do it without YOU! Typical homework would include vocabulary (word definitions), grammar, math, practice spelling tests, reading aloud to you, help finding current events on the internet, classroom computer homework or remedial work such as flashcards (addition and multiplication) and reading sight words.


This Mother's Day, make a bright gift for someone special in your life.



- Cardstock
- Tape
- Mason jar
- Primer paint
- Acrylic paint (3 colors)
- Paintbrushes
- Battery-operated tea light
- Paper and pen
- Hole punch
- Twine

What you do:

- 1. Cut out two cardstock hearts and tape them to the jar sides, near the bottom.
- 2. Paint the entire jar with primer paint. Let dry.
- 3. Paint splotches of acrylic paint over the primer. Let dry. Remove the heart shapes.
- 4. Place the tea light in the jar.
- 5. Write a note that says, "Mom, you're the light of my life!" Punch a hole in one corner of the note, thread twine through the hole and tie the note around the jar's neck.
