Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



"What would you do if Christ himself with all the angels were visibly to descend, and command you in your home to sweep your house and wash the pans and kettles? How happy you would feel, and would not know how to act for joy, not for the work's sake, but that you knew that thereby you were serving him, who is greater than heaven and earth."

- The Sermons of Martin Luther, Volume V

In talking with young adults around Los Angeles and Orange counties, one question that often comes up is "What do you do?" I am continually surprised and delighted with the responses I get:

- "Well, I manage a retail store, but my real passion is in urban photography."
- "I am a high school history teacher, but what I really love doing is working with stray animals at the Humane Society."
- "I'm a chemical engineer, but there is nothing I like doing better than playing blues on my quitar."

So often people will tell me what it is they do to make a living, and then follow up with what it is that gives them life. For Christians, the statement gets pushed one step further. Because God is the giver of life, what is it in our lives that connects us with God? What is our vocation?

Vocation comes from the Latin word *vocatio* which means "calling." Being a pastor and having gone through the long process it takes to get here, I have had numerous conversations around calling, many of them related to the ministry that I do. Sixteenth century theologian and founder of the Lutheran Church, Martin Luther understood calling to be more than just what professional ministers did, but something that all of God's people did. Vocation is that thing that God has called us to, and the way in which we live our lives as God's people. For some people, their career or job is a place where they live out their vocation. If not in the actual work they do, then in the manner in which they do that work or treat others around them.

For others their vocation may have nothing to do with their occupation, but is intrinsically wrapped up in their role as mother, brother, artist, environmentalist, Sunday school teacher, Stephen minister, helpful neighbor, and on and on. Indeed our vocation is not just one small area of our lives where God is at work, but the whole of our lives and how God is present in everything we do, from writing meeting memos, to changing diapers, to reading the Sunday lessons.

And so I leave you with these questions: What is your vocation? Where is the Holy Spirit at work in your life? How does your life, in all of its different parts, bring honor to God? May the Lord use your gifts to the glory of God.

Mama Hill's Help is an outreach in South Los Angeles which also helps in our area. Children come there weekly for homework assistance and to improve their reading and writing skills. They recently lost their church sponsor and need assistance to continue this ministry. They also need notebooks, pencils, and paper. Some of the supplies we receive for Study Buddies will be shared and delivered to Mama Hill's.

VBS VOLUNTEER MEETING AND DECORATION DAY SATURDAY, JULY 7, 10:00AM-1:00PM MOERER HALL




NEW PROGRAM AT EMANUEL

Beginning this fall, we are expanding our Children's Ministry by offering a free afterschool tutoring program called "Study Buddies." This program will be totally run by volunteers and is open to children of the congregation and as an outreach to children in our surrounding neighborhood. It will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30-5:30 PM for children in grades 1 through 6.

BUT before we can do this, we need to know how many of you might be interested in giving two hours a week (pick either Tuesday or Thursday) to help a child get his/her homework done for the night! We can't do it without YOU! Typical homework would include vocabulary (word definitions), grammar, math, practice spelling tests, reading aloud to you, help finding current events on the internet, classroom computer homework or remedial work such as flashcards (addition and multiplication) and reading sight words.

Kid's Korner




Summer is the perfect time to gaze at the wonders in the sky. Make this craft as a reminder of God's handiwork — including you!

What you need:

- Glass jar
- Permanent marker
- Glue (and water)
- Paper plate
- Paintbrush
- Star sequins
- Battery-operated tea light

What you do:

- 1. Around the jar's opening, write in permanent marker: Shine ... like stars in the sky. Philippians 2:15
- 2. Pour some glue on the plate. Thin with some water.
- 3. "Paint" the outside of the jar with glue and then sprinkle on some sequins. Let dry.
- 4. Add the tea light and give your bedroom a starry glow at nighttime.
