

Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



The Joy Circle is a monthly Bible Study and fellowship time for women. Our time together centers around discussion on that month's Bible Study. June's study focused on prayer as the time in which we reconnect and evaluate our relationship with God. That includes evaluating what we put ahead of God. The following is an excerpt from the study written by Dr. Anna Marsden for the June issue of Gather, the magazine of the Women of the ELCA.

1 Samuel 12:18-23

¹⁸Then Samuel called on the LORD, and that same day the LORD sent thunder and rain. So all the people stood in awe of the LORD and of Samuel.

¹⁹The people all said to Samuel, "Pray to the LORD your God for your servants so that we will not die, for we have added to all our other sins the evil of asking for a king."

²⁰"Do not be afraid," Samuel replied. "You have done all this evil; yet do not turn away from the LORD, but serve the LORD with all your heart. ²¹Do not turn away after useless idols. They can do you no good, nor can they rescue you, because they are useless. ²²For the sake of his great name the LORD will not reject his people, because the LORD was pleased to make you his own. ²³As for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD by failing to pray for you. And I will teach you the way that is good and right.

It's not coincidental that the First Commandment of the Ten is, "You shall have no other gods than me." That is, God knew that there are options. Anything we consider to be most important—even in a passing moment—is our god; it's the thing or the person to which we give our loyalty and our allegiance. So when God said, "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me," God was doing two things: identifying who God is by way of a history of liberation, and acknowledging that even the saving event of the Exodus wouldn't be sufficiently impressive to convince God's people of unswerving loyalty; they would be (and are) chronically tempted by other gods.

Martin Luther defined a god as that in which or in whom we place our ultimate trust, namely the thing that in any given moment is most important to us. It's not always so easy to tell what is what and who is who, though. False gods can be sneaky. That is, it's easy to identify malignant gods, things that can obviously destroy us: money, security, fame, addictions and so forth. However, sometimes even benign things can become our gods: people who are key to us, for example, like children, partners or parents can become more important to us than anything else in the world. Regardless of whether they are sneaky or obvious, a god demands loyalty or receives it from us whether it wants it or not. For example, if status becomes most important to us, then we sacrifice all of our identity to be defined by it: our clothes, our house, our car all become expressions of our ultimate trust. Sometimes these gods become ours without our consciously realizing it.

We often hear that God answers prayers. However, that doesn't mean that God always answers our prayers as we want or as we expect. That said, these passages suggest that sometimes God does answer our prayers exactly as we frame them, even when God disagrees with our petition. There seems to be a relationship between our requests, the motivation for our requests and our willingness and ability to hear and respond to God's response. Perhaps this passage invites us to consider the basis of our prayer requests, our receptivity to God's word in return to us and our trust that, as Samuel says, "...the Lord will not reject his people, because the Lord was pleased to make you his own." (1 Samuel 12:22)

It is in the discomfort of trying new things that we breathe life into new opportunities for learning and growth. I am confident that you all will live into this year with me, discerning God's Spirit with me, allowing me to try new things, lifting me up and encouraging me when it goes well, and constructively discussing how to do things differently when they do not go as well. Together we will see where God is at work in me and in all of you.

Thank you all again for your generosity and hospitality in my first days and weeks here. I can only hope that through these blessings I can be a blessing to you all as well!

COMMUNITY SHARING AND CARING OUTREACH:

STUDY BUDDIES and MAMA HILL'S HOUSE MINISTRIES!

During July and August, we were inundated with school supplies for these ministries. Notebooks, pencils, markers, paper, crayons, staplers, glue, backpacks, and other necessities are now on hand for Study Buddies. Supplies were also taken to Mama Hill's House on August 19 by John and Mischelle Uhlman. What a wonderful outpouring of gifts for children to aid them in their education. Thank you to all at Emanuel who chose to support this ministry.

MATTHEW 25 GRANT:

We are collaborating with the La Habra Family Resource Center in making the best use of this grant to PREVENT older women from becoming homeless. Often someone may be managing from month-to-month, but an unexpected expense, such as a car repair or a medical bill, can make them unable to pay their housing cost. This will allow emergency grants for them to retain their home and not fall into the loss spiral. A total of \$965.84 was sent to the center and will be used specifically to prevent older women from becoming homeless. As the grant is dispensed, we will be notified how the money was used and how it has been leveraged. We will be applying for the grant again in October.

Your HAHO ministry team members have also committed personally to increasing these funds. Won't you join us? If you would like, you can make a contribution by using a pew envelope and marking it "Matthew 25 Grant."

Matthew 25:35-40 (English Standard Version/ESV)

³⁵ For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶ I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' ³⁷ Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? ³⁸ And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? ³⁹ And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' ⁴⁰ And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'

FRISTERS:

Now that school is back in session, the FRISTERS will begin meeting weekly. FRISTERS is a Christian-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that is dedicated to breaking the cycle of poverty and abuse within the teen parent population by providing education, access to resources, role models and support to teen mothers and their children. Fristers currently serves 700 mothers and children annually through six chapter locations throughout Orange County. Emanuel has supported this ministry for several years through the donation of children's books, diapers and wipes, and gifts for the children at Christmas. The current book title will be announced soon. At this time, due to very generous donations this past year, we have a large balance toward the costs of those books. If you would like to make a donation for books, that is wonderful. Otherwise, if you would like to share your gift with another ministry at this time, that would be also be much-appreciated.

EVANGELISM: "Take It To The Lord In Prayer" — prayers for our church, our pastor, our world, and any special needs, in the Chapel or wherever you are at 8:30 on Saturday mornings. We now have eight people praying every week. Join us. We are hoping to run out of space in the Chapel and move to a larger prayer space. If you have a prayer request, please let the Pastor or Vicar know and it will be lifted up. We have met and prayed weekly for over five years and we continue to see miracles.

EMANUEL PROPERTY CARE TEAM



The Property Care Team met on Saturday, August 18, to discuss repairs, maintenance and projects for our Emanuel Home.

There are many opportunities, some requiring minimal time and ability, others requiring more time or on-going care, and some requiring outside professional help. More than 25 items, large and small, were taken for implementation. Things like patching a hole, fixing a door stop, and disposing of old items will be fixed in short order. We have created a "Honey-Do" board which will be available in Moerer Hall. If you see something which needs attention, please put it on a post-it and stick it on the board. If you see something there you can do, please take the post-it and do it. This will greatly help in keeping our facility in tip-top shape at all times.

In addition, we are looking at repairs such as fixing the metal fence. If you have a welding machine and know how to use it, please contact Keith Kruse, Jack Ward, or the church office. Additionally, upgrading our restrooms in the sanctuary and Moerer Hall will provide a welcoming experience for our members and visitors. This will require new tile and paint. 



Kid's korner



What you do:

- 1. Across the paper horizontally, write with the white crayon "Miracles happen!" (or a Bible verse such as Job 5:9; Psalm 77:14; Jeremiah 32:27; or Matthew 19:26).
