



Calling All Men!!!!

I think this is the first time I have written that for any publication, ever. But I wanted to take this opportunity to write a little about the ministry that has been going on for a number of years and an opportunity for the men of our congregation to reconnect with God and other men of faith.

Those of you who were at Emanuel on September 9th may have heard the staff members of Lutheran Retreats, Camps & Conferences talk about the Men's Advance taking place the last weekend in October at EL Camino Pines (the partner camp to Luther Glen). El Camino is set in the mountains outside of Frazier Park and offers a majestic place to get away from the world.

For the past four years many of our adult women have been blessed by taking a weekend away for the Women's retreats in Murrieta. Many of them will testify that some of the most valuable time of our retreats is simply to get away from all of the things that busy our lives and spend a weekend with other sisters in Christ. I believe the men of Emanuel can also benefit from this type of weekend.

I have been exploring themes of identity. During worship in early in September, the Pharisees rebuked Jesus and his disciples for not washing their hands before they ate, and Jesus answered, "there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile" (Mark 7:15), bringing into question the identity we show versus the identity we act on. We are the observable of what God is up to in the world. Then we moved our way in the Gospel of Mark to two stories of Jesus healing (Mark 7:24-37). One healing was of Jesus ordering a man's mouth, one suffering from a speech impediment, to "be opened," and in the same breath ordering all to be silent about what just happened. To which, I ask the question, "Jesus, how will the



world know who you are? How will we know your identity?" Bringing us to another Gospel lesson in Mark, where Jesus asks, "Who do the people say that I am... and who do you say that I am?" (Mark 8:27-38). And as Jesus explains to Peter and the other disciples what it means to be the Messiah, their ideas of identity, who Jesus is, who God is, and ultimately who they are is called into question.

Now, I don't relay all of this information so you can go back and read all of these stories, even if that is a good idea. I remind you of them because each day while I am here at Emanuel, my identity is shifting and I don't just mean because of what I will choose to wear to this year's **Trunk-or-Treat**. But with each day and lesson my identity is crumbling and being made new! Yes, I am still a Minnesotan, a daughter, a sister, and a friend. But each day Jesus calls me to "be opened" to the life God is calling me, to a life of ordained ministry. I am reminded my identity is rooted in God's love for me, and God's plan for my life. Sometimes I think, great, God has got this all figured out. I don't have to do it on my own. But other times I don't want to give up total control of my life (thank goodness God loves me anyways).

Most recently, I served at Christ Church Lutheran in Minneapolis, MN, as Children's Ministry Director. At Christ there were a few members who were pastors. One pastor in particular, who was not retired, but was not currently working in a parish, was named Pastor Mary. Mary would always call me Pastor Maria. At first, I would reprimand her saying, "Shhhhhh! Pastor Mary, you cannot call me that! I am not a pastor yet." And her response was always the same, "But you are a pastor to me."

Little did I know, but she was planting seeds in my pastoral formation field. As I look back on my life, I can see different moments where other seeds were being planted for my pastoral identity. And I am grateful to all of you at Emanuel for voluntarily becoming farmers for my pastoral identity. Thank you for showing up and inviting me in. Thank you for allowing me to serve you and make mistakes. Thank you for helping me claim my identity as pastor and for planting seeds. I ask for your prayers as my identity as a pastor of the ELCA is constantly being shaped and formed throughout our year together.

Before I sign off, know that my pastoral formation and identity started as a small seed planted when I was a child. That seed has been tended to and cared for at each stage of my life. Our identity formations don't stop at any one destination. Our identities will take new shapes at the trunk-ortreat, and at the end of the month we will remember our Lutheran identities celebrating Reformation Day (October 31st). We commemorate Martin Luther and the reformers from over 500 years ago and remember God is still transforming our faith and the world. Learn more about Martin Luther and the Reformation with us and attend our Catechism Revisited Day at the Danish Lutheran Church (October 13th).

Our formations and reformations are continuous in our lives of faith. I pray for each of you in the formation of your identities, and that together we will continue to rely on God's strength and continue in the mission God has called us.

- One Grocery gift card to any major grocery store (minimum of \$20.00)
- *One Box/Container of Stuffing Mix*
- Two Packets of Dry Gravy or Two Cans of Turkey Gravy
- One Box/Bag of Instant Mashed Potatoes

- Two Cans Green Beans
- One Large Can of Yams
- Two Cans of Chicken Broth
- One Can of Cranberry Sauce

You can also add additional items if you wish.

Please provide a card with a note from you for the family that will receive your bag.

MATTHEW 25 GRANT: We are collaborating with the La Habra Family Resource Center in making the best use of this grant to PREVENT older women from becoming homeless. Often someone may be managing from month-to-month, but an unexpected expense, such as a car repair or a medical bill, can make them unable to pay their housing costs. This will allow emergency grants for them to retain their home and not fall into the loss spiral. A total of \$965.84 was sent to the center and will be used specifically to prevent older women from becoming homeless. As the grant is dispensed, we will be notified how the money was used and how it has been leveraged. We will be applying for the grant again this month.

FRISTERS: Now that school is back in session, FRISTERS will begin meeting weekly. FRISTERS is a Christian-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that is dedicated to breaking the cycle of poverty and abuse within the teen parent population by providing education, access to resources, role models and support to teen mothers and their children. Fristers currently serves 700 mothers and children annually through six chapter locations throughout Orange County. Emanuel has supported this ministry for several years through the donation of children's books, diapers and wipes, and gifts for the children at Christmas. The current book title will be announced soon. At this time, due to very generous donations this past year, we have a large balance toward the costs of these books. If you would like to make a donation for books, that is wonderful. Otherwise, if you would like to share your gift with another ministry at this time, that would be also be much-appreciated.

EVANGELISM:

Did you know that we have business cards with a picture of our stained glass window, our service times, and Pastor Cate's name on it? They are quite beautiful. Take a couple and keep them in your wallet. You never know when you might have the opportunity to share the GOOD NEWS which we proclaim at Emanuel.

"Take It To The Lord In Prayer" — prayers for our church, our pastor, our world, and any special needs, in the Chapel or wherever you are at 8:30 on Saturday mornings. We now have eight people praying every week. Join us. We are hoping to run out of space in the Chapel and move to a larger prayer space. If you have a prayer request, please let the Pastor or Vicar know and it will be lifted up. We have met and prayed weekly for over five years and we continue to see miracles.
