How do you get the Good News?

Hopefully the answer is, "By reading my Bible!" However, I am asking how you get your *other* Good News, the Emanuel monthly newsletter called "The Good News."

In the past few years we have noticed that many people within our congregation prefer to receive the "Good News" newsletter digitally via email or on our website, or by picking up a printed copy at church

Due to some inefficiencies of the Bulk Rate Mailing System, in the next month we will be moving away from sending the Good News via bulk rate US Mail. The Psalms is one of my favorite books in the Bible. Being an English major in college, I grew to love poems even more than I already had. I was a published poet in second grade for a poem titled *Crazy*. Ask me about it and I will recite it to you. As I grew in faith and began to wonder about the Psalms, I realized quite quickly that the Psalms held the songs and poetry of our faith.



Now I am not naive, I know that poetry is sometimes hard to access. And it can be hard to understand. So when the Wednesday morning Bible Study group was looking for a new area of study and I realized they had never touched the Psalms, I suggested we do a guided walk through the Psalms. Together we will explore the poetry of the Psalms and the full range of human emotion and experience expressed in the Psalms. The vast array of voices included in the Psalms gives us a more expansive idea of what a relationship with God looks like and the ups and downs of human life.

Martin Luther sums up his ideas of the Psalms saying:

[The Psalter] might well be called a little Bible. In it is comprehended most beautifully and briefly everything that is in the entire Bible. It is really a fine enchiridion or handbook. In fact, I have a notion that the Holy Spirit wanted to take the trouble himself to compile a short Bible and book of examples of all Christendom or all saints, so that anyone who could not read the whole Bible would have anyway almost an entire summary of it, comprised in one little book.

I encourage you if you are available on Wednesday mornings from 9:00-10:00 AM to consider coming and joining us in our study of this book that is in a way a summary of the whole Bible as told from a symphony of voices — voices that I hope will become our own when we cannot find the right words in times of need, or grief, or in times of praise and thanksgiving.

If you work during the day or simply are unable to make it, know that the Wednesday Morning Bible Study holds you in prayer and invites you into the Psalms in your own personal study.

<u>LA HABRA COMMUNITY RESOURCE CARE CENTER:</u> HAHO invites you to share the love this month by contributing food for the La Habra Community Resource Care Center in our receptacle in the Narthex or by contributing dollars to the LHCRCC through the Good Samaritan Fund, which provides housing vouchers and other help for emergency needs.

<u>FRISTERS</u>: We purchased *Miss Bindergarten Goes to Kindergarten* for the Kidsters so each child will have a book of his/her own and they will be able to read together and learn about their exciting future time in school.

The Fristers' 2018 Annual Report has the following statistics, and Emanuel is part of the solution. Pastor Cate and Emanuel were acknowledged as supporters in a retirement event for Pastor Elaine Friesen who has been the leader of the La Habra Chapter:

- There are now 5 Fristers Chapters in Orange County with plans for more
- 14 Moms graduated from the Life Coach Program
- 38 couples (yes, Fristers helps supports dads, too!) received education and support to build a healthy relationship
- 211 moms were equipped and empowered
- 192 meals were served to moms, dads, couples, and children
- 195 successful links connecting parents to resources in the community
- 9,000 hours donated by volunteers and interns
- 272 children prepared for kindergarten
- 571 parents and children improved their lives
- \$300,000 in-kind donations

Impressive numbers . . . And YOU are there!



Kid's Korner

A MESSAGE OF

Make this valentine for a family member or friend.



What you need:

- 10 wooden craft sticks
