

#### **Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr**



- Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- Jesus Christ loves you and keeps you now and always.
- Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return.

All three of these sayings are common in our church. Each take place at very different times in our lives, however they all have something in common. When each one is said, they are accompanied by the sign of the cross made on a person's forehead.

The first one takes place once in our lifetime, at the moment of baptism. For some of us that is very early in life, perhaps even before we remember. The water is poured over our head in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Then anointing oil, to remember that we belong to Christ the King, is used to mark the sign of the cross and claim we are God's beloved child.

The second phrase is one that may vary from time to time and can happen many times throughout a person's life. It is one that is given to some who come to the communion rail seeking to be part of the community gathered around the Table of God. We welcome all people to the table of Jesus Christ. But to those who are not yet baptized, for children too young to participate, or for those who choose not to eat and drink of the Body of Christ, a mark is made on their forehead reminding them that they are blessed to be at the table of Jesus Christ.

The third phrase comes once a year, on Ash Wednesday. We gather together to begin the 40-day journey into Lent and ashes are placed on our foreheads in the mark of the cross as the words are said "remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." In the Old Testament the practice of putting ashes on oneself had a few main uses, one was to a mark a person in mourning, similar to wearing black clothes in today's culture. The other main use was to show a sign of remorse and repentance. It is this use that we remember on Ash Wednesday.

To those who have never seen it, this may seem like quite a somber thing to "celebrate." But as people who are living in the light of the resurrection, we are lifted up this day to remember our sinfulness, not because we feel the need to belittle and berate ourselves. We do so **BECAUSE WE ARE FORGIVEN BY A LORD WHO WASHES OUR SINS AWAY THROUGH HIS DEATH AND RESURRECTION.** Okay, bold, all caps and underlining might have been a little overkill, but I want to stress the real purpose of spending introspective time during this Lenten season is not to wallow in our failures but to remember through everything, Jesus Christ is the Lamb who takes away the sins of the world. That, my friends, is very Good News.

Lately, I have been thinking a lot about God's revealing Godself to us. Part of it is that the season in between Christmas and Lent, a season called Epiphany is planned just for that. Epiphany is a season where our lessons in worship are preparing us for our journey through Lent. God's ultimate revealing of who God is when Jesus goes to the cross for us, endures suffering for us, dies, is buried, and after three days he rises from the dead for us, so that we too might be resurrected into the newness of life.



Today it is sometimes easy to lose sight of what is really important. And it is hard to take the time, not only to listen to God, but also to others. Voices that might be different then our own. In undergrad, while singing in the Concordia Choir, we sang a song called, "The Rune of Hospitality." The text is an old Irish poem. The text invites the hearer to imagine Christ in the disguise of the stranger and begs to ask the question how will you serve him, this Christ in the stranger's guise? It makes us all think about how we listen to the needs of those who are different than us, those we disagree with, and those with whom we find it difficult to love. However, that is what we are called to do in Christ.

This Lenten season we are offering midweek Lent services titled "The Voices of Lent." Pastor Cate and I have invited pastors and leaders of congregations in our area to come offer their interpretation on the Lenten journey (see schedule below). We figure you hear enough of our voices, why not include voices different from our own. Also during our Lenten worship we invite you all to lift up your voices in song as we will be singing Holden Evening Prayer.

Join us for midweek services starting Wednesday, March 6 (Ash Wednesday) and throughout the Lenten season on Wednesdays at 10:15 AM, or Thursdays at 6:45 PM. Come, listen, and add your voice to "The Voices of Lent."

#### **COMMUNITY SHARING AND CARING OUTREACH:**

<u>LA HABRA COMMUNITY RESOURCE CARE CENTER:</u> During February, HAHO encouraged donations of canned goods and money for the LHCRCC. More than \$100 plus \$250 in our operational budget every month help provide housing vouchers and other help for emergency needs.

#### PROPERTY CARE TEAM

Very recently, we found that our alarm system needed a new battery. When we called our vendor, they were willing to come, but the minimum charge was \$500 plus parts (the batteries). In addition, our very talented team of Keith Kruse, Wolfgang Hessel, and Jack Ward took on the project of refinishing the table in the narthex, which had not been well maintained.



They spent many hours sanding, polishing, and refinishing, as well as trying to dodge the wet weather since the table required some outside sunshine to cure. The outcome is breathtaking. Be sure to look in person.

It has been 6 months since we last met to focus on repairs and maintenance for our beautiful church home. Since that time, much has been accomplished; however, a little sprucing up prior to Easter would be great. The following items have been posted to our "HONEY-DO" list in Moerer Hall. Can YOU help?

- 1. BATHROOM LIGHT SWITCHES (Auto off): Install remaining switches which are already on site.
- 2. SPINNING CASTERS ON CHOIR MUSIC CART: Purchase and install.
- 3. REPLACE DOOR STOPS ON UPSTAIRS SANCTUARY RESTROOM AND HOPE CENTER WORKROOM: Purchase and install.
- 4. REMOVE/REPAINT WATER SPOTS ON SANCTUARY BRICKS: Determine cleaning and/or required painting.
- 5. PATCH AND TOUCH-UP PAINT IN NARTHEX.
- 6. SANCTUARY DOWNSTAIRS RESTROOM LIGHTING: Determine better/brighter lighting for safety.
- 7. REPAIR LOCK ON THE EAST ENTRY DOOR INTO THE SANCTUARY. Lock has been difficult to operate.
- 8. REPLACE DAMAGED CEILING TILES IN MOERER HALL.

We will meet on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>March 30 at 8:30 AM</u> in Moerer Hall. Refreshments will be served. Bring your expertise, your willing hands, and maybe a tool along. Members of House of Faith will be joining us in the focus.




#### **ADULT LAY-LED BIBLE STUDY**
