It sounds like the name of a liturgical rock band! Unfortunately, we haven't created anything quite that cool (yet!). During June and July, I have the great privilege of being a supervising pastor to TWO seminary interns. Vicar Maria, Vicar Matt and I have already spent a good deal of time in conversation together about church and life in ministry. Having been out of seminary for a number of years now, one of my favorite things is to listen in on the conversation between our two interns about what Vicar Matt is currently studying and what insight Vicar Maria can give him about a particular class or professor.

We have also had some silly shenanigans like "Alb-Fest 2019!!" where we had Vicar Matt try on different albs (robes worn in worship) to find the best one for him to use when leading worship. Which of course led Vicar Maria and I to put on our clergy wear and taking a Sacristy Selfie.



We also took a field trip to downtown Los Angeles where we toured the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angeles. Our docent told us

so much about the church architecture and about how different parts of the cathedral are used. It was fascinating to hear her explanation of the attention to detail that went into the building. For example, the light fixtures within the main sanctuary are triangle shaped to represent the Trinity. Additionally, the chair that the Archbishop sits in when he is presiding at mass is made from wood coming from six different continents to represent the interconnectedness of God's church throughout the world.

The part I am most excited about is to see the congregation, you as the people of Emanuel, take the ownership and leadership in realizing the amazing

ministry you have and are continuing to take on. You are a church that trains the future pastors of the ELCA. This is a holy and awesome task. As Vicar Maria's time with us comes to a close, I know that she has expressed gratitude in not only the welcome of this church but in the way that she has been pushed and led by this congregation to serve God's people



wherever she is called. I am excited to see what insight Vicar Matt will take with him from this place when we live out Emanuel "God With Us."

Many of you who have seen my tattoo have asked me about it. I am sorry if you have heard this story before. For those of you who haven't, the words above the feather are "kimi to mata aeru," which is Japanese for "Until we meet again."



In 2011, I was in Japan during their March earthquake and subsequent tsunami. This was a wave that quite literally changed the tides of my life. I was performing at that time in the Young Americans music outreach touring company. Our three-month-long tour was shortened due to the burden we had placed on our gracious hosts. It was then that I learned this phrase in the Japanese language. The phrase "until we meet again" became a mantra for us. Even though we had to leave early, we knew one day we would return. I did return to Japan a year later. I was still performing with the

Young Americans; however, this time, my focus had shifted.

We were in northern Japan visiting the towns directly affected by the tsunami the year prior. This wasn't about performing, it was about bringing the light of Christ to all those I met. During this tour, I finally accepted that I was being called into ministry. That just so happened to be my final tour with the Young Americans before I began my journey to undergrad, seminary, to you, and ultimately to a life of full-time pastoral ministry.

The feather is one I found while running in St. Paul, MN after a dear friend died tragically. It reminds me of him, and also of my great-grandmother Louise who loved birds. The words, "until we meet again" and the feather together remind me of God's faithfulness and connects me to the great cloud of witnesses. This life is not the end of our stories, death will not have the final say. Because Jesus died for us and rose from the grave, death is no longer the victor. We will all meet again in the kingdom of Heaven.

My tattoo, reminds me of this journey into the ministry. It reminds me of all the people and experiences that have helped shape the person I am today. It reminds me of God's faithfulness and the defeat over sin and death.

As I prepare over the next month to leave Emanuel Lutheran Church to return to Minnesota to complete this journey set in motion many years ago, I am reminded of this mantra: "Kimi to mata aeru," "until we meet again," in this life or at the table of the feast of our Lord. I pray that you would continue in the journey you began years ago with the first intern called to this place. That you continue to raise up new leaders for the sake of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I pray you continue in the journey we started together of sharing your stories, the stories of mission and ministry of God with us, that you wouldn't keep these stories to yourselves but share them with all you encounter. And, please know, that as I leave, I carry Emanuel with me, the place and our God: Until we meet again.



Kid's Korner



Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw

What you do:

- Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!
