

Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



I have a clergy coach who I speak with once a month. She is someone who pushes me to explore in-depth some of the ways in which I go about my life in ministry. In our last conversation, she asked me what are my favorite parts of being a pastor. I threw out a few different things but went into great depth when I talked about the joy I find in fostering discipleship. I shared about how excited I was when we were looking for a new VBS director and two women who were brand new volunteers to the VBS program stepped up to run an amazing program. I also talked about how at the last annual meeting we had two new people join the council who have never served as council members before and how poignant their insight has been to the ministry of this church. I also shared how one of our teenagers when asked to serve on the internship committee this year didn't hesitate to offer his voice and insight to our new vicar's committee.

I told my clergy coach, "I love helping people stretch their ministry legs. It doesn't have to be a big jump but people are often able to serve God beyond what they think they can." She went on to tell me about an article she wrote almost four years ago on this very topic. Her article talked about a common stewardship practice that many churches will adopt that asked people to look at their monetary giving and asked them to increase or "stretch" one step. For example if you give 5% of your income it encourages you to stretch one step further and consider giving 6% and using that as a way to increase our trust that God will provide. The article talked about looking not only at money but the way people give of their time and talents and proposed a way to do the same stretching with the ministry God has given us.

For example, if you dedicate one hour a week to the Lord (Sunday worship for example) are you willing to stretch it to two? Perhaps you could spend 10 minutes in prayer Monday through Saturday or join a midweek Bible study. Do you give four or five hours a week to God and ministry in His name? Maybe you could push that just a little further and volunteer as a church usher or make it a point to visit a homebound neighbor. Maybe you don't set any time aside for God, maybe your life is too busy as it is. Perhaps you can start with one hour a month. Come to church, be with God's people and go from there.

As we come up upon our 60th anniversary, I plan to encourage the good people of Emanuel to stretch their ministry legs. Over the next year I plan to carve out time in my schedule to listen to and pray for the people of Emanuel to help determine where and how God is calling you to ministry. If you get an email, call or text from me in the near future, know that I am here to do what I think God is pushing me to do, to walk along side the people of Emanuel and to listen to God's calling in each of our lives.

Matt's Motivational Minute




Hello Emanuel family! I am excited to be partnering with you in this ministry and it's been exciting to get to start working here! This month I have had the opportunity to go with Vicar Maria on visits to members in their homes or in care facilities. This has been an awesome opportunity to meet members of our church community. I have also been able to attend the midweek worship service at the synod office and meet Bishop Andy Taylor. I am continuing to get to know the community of Emanuel and the members of our family. It is a great opportunity and I enjoy getting to know each of you more.

As many of you know, I am a full-time student in addition to working at Emanuel part-time. This is a great opportunity to learn from my classes and be able to share that information immediately with you! In my *Gospel of Mark* course, we are reading Shelly Rambo's book *Resurrecting Wounds*. This book is a great book for not only myself and classmates but for others as well. In the book it discusses how when something traumatic happens to someone we often ask that person to "get over it." In the book it invites us as Christians to accompany those around us during these traumatic times and let them know it is okay to have these wounds.

In the book she uses the story of doubting Thomas in the Gospel of John (John 20:24-29) as the lens to view things. She focuses on Thomas' encounter with Jesus and the invitation for Thomas to touch the wounds of Jesus after he is resurrected. She discusses how wounds surface in the midst of human interactions. Traditionally we focus on the afterlife, but she discusses a theology of resurrection wounds in the living. She returns to Christ's woundedness as a way to discover how we live with our own wounds. We are all wounded in some way or another and never know when the wounds will reappear, but Shelly Rambo helps us to recognize wounds in ourselves and others. She does a good job of getting us to face social and personal traumas. It can be hard to share our traumas or past hurts, but this book and course invites us to explore and share our traumas with each other as we are all called to this ministry as Christians!




