

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

Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



"What would you do if Christ himself with all the angels were visibly to descend, and command you in your home to sweep your house and wash the pans and kettles? How happy you would feel, and would not know how to act for joy, not for the work's sake, but that you knew that thereby you were serving him, who is greater than heaven and earth."

- The Sermons of Martin Luther, Volume V

When I meet new people, one of the first questions is often, "What do you do?" I am continually surprised and delighted with the responses I get:

- "Well, I manage a retail store, but my real passion is in urban photography."
- "I am a High School History Teacher, but what I really love doing is working with stray animals at the Humane Society."
- "I'm a chemical engineer, but there is nothing I like doing better than playing blues on my guitar."

So often people will tell me what it is they do to make a living, and then follow up with what it is that gives them life. For Christians, the statement gets pushed one step further. Because God is the giver of life, what is it in our lives that connects us with God, what is our vocation?

Vocation comes from the Latin word *vocatio* which means "calling." Being a pastor and having gone through the long process it takes to get here, I have had numerous conversations around calling, many of them related to the ministry that I do. Additionally, working with our interns over the past two years I have had plenty of conversations about vocation. Sixteenth century theologian and founder of the Lutheran Church, Martin Luther understood calling to be more than just what professional ministers did, but something that all of God's people did. Vocation is that thing that God has called us to, and the way in which we live our lives as God's people. For some, their career or job is a place where they live out their vocation. If not in the actual work they do, then in the manner in which they do that work or treat others around them. Vocation includes the identity we carry into our families, our churches, our work and friendships.

For others their vocation may have nothing to do with their occupation, but it is intrinsically wrapped up in the role as mother, brother, artist, environmentalist, Sunday School teacher, Stephen minister, helpful neighbor, and on and on. Indeed our vocation is not just one small area of our lives where God is at work, but the whole of our lives and how God is present in everything we do, from writing meeting memos, to changing diapers, to reading the Sunday lessons.

And so I leave you with these questions: What is your vocation? Where is the Holy Spirit at work in your life? How does your life, in all of its different parts, bring honor to God? May the Lord use your gifts to the glory of God.

COMMUNITY SHARING AND CARING OUTREACH:

HIS HOUSE: HIS House exists to help people overcome homelessness and achieve independence. Since 1989, HIS House has provided shelter and support services to more than 3,800 homeless men, women and children. Part of the grant we are receiving from Thrivent will be dedicated to this wonderful ministry to overcome homelessness. <u>STUDY BUDDIES</u>, <u>MAMA HILL'S HOUSE and THRIVENT</u>: Study Buddies resumed August 27. They have a lot of school supplies, but they are in need of gift cards to purchase snacks and rewards. Gift cards may be designated and put in the offering or left in the church office.

During August we collected and delivered notebooks, pens, pencils, and other school supplies to Mama Hill's House. We also collected several pairs of athletic shoes which were donated through our local Thrivent chapter.

<u>PATRIOTS & PAWS:</u> Patriots & Paws will be hosting an open house at the new warehouse (1825 E. Via Burton, Anaheim) on Saturday, September 21, from 8:00-2:00 PM. Come and meet some veterans, see the warehouse and have breakfast or lunch for \$5.00. More than 100 veterans and military families are assisted every month by this ministry. We will again be providing Holiday Dinner Bags for our veterans in November.

WANDS FOR WILDLIFE "WANDRAISER"— NEW OPPORTUNITY: Now through October 20, a box will be in the Narthex. Gather up your old mascara wands (clean them if possible) and put in the box. They will be mailed to Wands for Wildlife. Old mascara wands are used to remove fly eggs and larva from the fur and feathers of wild animals. They work well because the bristles are close together. What a great way to help our animals and recycle!





EYEGLASSES/CASES: Used eyeglasses and cases are again being collected for the Lions Club to assist people who need help with their vision. A box is in the narthex until October 20. Are we making a difference with these glasses? The La Habra Journal reports that in June 2019, the Lions, a part of the international Lions and Knights of the Blind, held a free vision screening event open to everyone regardless of age or income. A total of 234 adults and children had their vision tested by volunteer opticians. That day 158 people went home with glasses, and another 25 people will receive new glasses made at the optical lab — a total of 183 patients received new or recycled eyeglasses! This was a life-changing event for them. Imagine being able to see clearly for the first time in your life!

EVANGELISM:

THE BLUE SHOPPING BAGS ARE BACK! If you need a new bag, they are available, just let us know. The La Habra Resource Community Care Center is now distributing food to members of our community by letting them "shop" and pick up the items. Hortencia Vizcarra, the Executive Director, has requested that we provide bags for this ministry. Not only will we be providing a service to the center, but Emanuel's bags will be all over our community.

Did you know we have business cards with a picture of our stained glass window, our church information, and our Pastor's name on them? They are quite beautiful. Take a couple and keep them in your wallet. You never know when you might have the opportunity to share the GOOD NEWS which we proclaim at Emanuel.

"Take It To The Lord In Prayer" — prayers for our church, our pastor, our world, and any special needs, in the Chapel or wherever you are at 8:30 on Saturday mornings. We now have eight people praying every week. Join us. We are hoping to run out of space in the Chapel and move to a larger prayer space. If you have a prayer request, please let the Pastor or Vicar know and it will be lifted up. We have met and prayed weekly for over six years and we continue to see miracles.







GROWING generations


Honor your grandparents with a gift that all generations can enjoy.
