New Life

During quarantine, one of the things I have been doing frequently is playing games over Zoom with friends and family. I was playing games with some friends and I commented on how beautiful it is to see the birds, rabbits, foxes, and other animals coming out now that people are not out in nature as much. It's almost as if now that people are out of the way nature is taking back its land! To this phrase, one of my friends who is struggling through a cold snap in the upper mid-west said, "Whatever, Pollyanna!" We had a good laugh and I know her comments were based more on her jealousy of our nice weather than they were on the joy of nature.

It got me thinking though, this time is difficult. Many people are ill, many people are suffering, many people are without jobs or are working jobs with VERY long hours. People are missing their friends, missing their families, missing their normal lives. This is a difficult time, and there is new life coming out of it.

We are people who celebrate the new life received through Jesus Christ; however, we only have that life because he was first crucified. Death led to new life. I think about all of the things in our lives that have changed in the last two months and what new life has come from that. What death and new life has occurred?

<u>DEATH</u>

People who are used to gathering every Sunday for worship cannot be at our church.

Our Wednesday Morning Bible Study cannot met at the church building.

Our tried and true traditions of how we have always done church are put on hold or not happening.

NEW LIFE

Our online worship is reaching people who live all over the country. It is reaching people who haven't been in church for years. It's reaching people every week who may have only come to Sunday worship once or twice a year.

Our Wednesday Morning Zoom Bible Study has more people and different people attending faithfully each week who would not have been able to attend in person.

We are being forced to look at what we have always done and ask the questions, "How is God being Glorified, our neighbors being served, and the Good news of Jesus Christ being shared?"

I am saddened by what we are no longer able to do, but I am so excited to see what new life Christ is creating!!

We could not imagine then all the awesome people and experiences that have happened to us while we have been here! We embraced all the unexpected (sometimes reluctantly!) but we never saw coming what has happened. While our time together has been impacted and influenced by this pandemic, I look forward to what the next year holds for us and what opportunities will come our way that we did not see coming!






CHRIST IN OUR HOME
