




LISTENING FOR GOD

This Summer a group of 22 people were split into two groups for a virtual book club where we weekly read and discus a chapter from the book *Listening for God*. This book is a compilation of short stories with discussion questions at the end of each story. All of the stories have a component of listening for God in unique places.

Confession time—I picked this book because it was an easy one for people to jump in and out of, we had a copy on the church library shelves, and the editors gave discussion questions so I didn't have to work very hard. However, when we started the first few stories I thought I had gotten myself in way over my head.

When I hear "short story" I think of a light-hearted narrative, maybe something like a fable with a nice moral at the end. That was not true for these stories! The first story was a heavy one to read. Then the second one was even more dense, and on and on they went. In discussing several of the stories, many members of the book club would share that they didn't enjoy the stories at all. I was worried that I had chosen poorly.



However, as the weeks have continued, even though the stories have not gotten any easier or lighter, our discussions have become richer and overall many people have been "enjoying" the book club. One of the overwhelming sentiments is that even though these stories are heavy or sad, they have opened up a wealth of places to Listen for God. Often times we come into situations of prayer ready to *talk to God* or *search for God*, but it takes a great amount of dedication and intentional quieting of the mind to pause and *listen for God*.

This book club has opened me up (and many book club members) to realize that God does not just speak to us through scripture, or sermon or song. Sometimes God speaks to us in unexpected ways. Our job is to create the space in our noisy lives (or at least quiet our noisy internal thoughts) and make ourselves people who are *listening for God*.

Matt's Motivational Minute



"I believe that God can and will let good come out of everything, even the greatest evil. For that to happen, God needs human beings who let everything work out for the best."

—Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Have you heard of Dietrich Bonhoeffer before? He may be the most popular Lutheran pastor behind Martin Luther himself. I am currently in an independent study with eight of my classmates in a course called "Ministry in Pandemic." COVID-19 clearly has impacted our lives and during this course we are looking at different people in the Bible and other Christians who suffered from exile or isolation during their lifetime that can provide some insights for us today during this global pandemic. Bonhoeffer was a German pastor who helped to conspire a plan to overthrow Adolf Hitler and the Nazi Regime. Unfortunately for Bonhoeffer he was imprisoned and ultimately executed. During his two years when he was in prison, he was isolated, cut off from family and friends, and faced an uncertain future. While he had times of doubt, depression and fear for the future, he also used this time to reflect on the church. He used his time in prison to re-imagine and dream of the future for the church. One of his biggest questions he tried to answer was "What is Christianity or who is Christ actually for us today?" When he was exploring this HUGE question, he realized that Christ, when on earth, served as an example for us by caring for others. It is when we look outside of ourselves that we are living into the calling that Christ has for us.

SOOOOOOO during this time of exile, isolation and uncertainty what would it look like if we took time to reflect on our own individual faith and reflect on the meaning of church? What if we could listen for the small whispers of the Holy Spirit calling us forward to live out God's plan? COVID-19 has been an extreme challenge, but we can use this time for prayer, listening and reflection so that it won't be a waste of time. God has a calling for each of us and I look forward to seeing where God takes us all!

Greetings to all Emanuel Youth and Parents!

Each week we continue to present an online Sunday School lesson for our youth. We do not yet know when we will come back in person for worship and Sunday School.

This past month we have learned so much about our how we can put what we have learned about God into action in our daily lives:

- 1. First of all, in the lesson about the ten men Jesus healed from leprosy, there was only one man who returned to thank Jesus. We discovered what it means to be grateful and that it is important for us to show our thanks to people.
- 2. During our "Light of the World" lesson we saw that our lights will never burn out because they are powered by Jesus. People will see our light when we show our love to God and to others through our actions.

TAKE IT TO THE LORD IN PRAYER



GREAT SUMMER GAMES

Though this year's Summer Olympics were postponed, you can host friendly neighborhood competitions.

What you need:


- Masking tape
- Large craft sticks
- Paper plates
- Balloons
- Ribbon
- Scissors
- Green construction paper
- Craft glue

What you do:

Balloon Badminton: Make rackets by taping a stick "handle" to each plate. Blow up and tie a balloon. Use the rackets to pass the balloon back and forth, without letting it touch the floor.

Rhythmic Routines: Using tape, firmly attach one end of a 4-foot ribbon to a craft stick. Display style and skill by waving it around. Try choreographing a routine to a praise song.

Champion Crown: Cut a large hole out of the center of a paper plate. Cut 2-inch ovals from green paper. Glue those "leaves" to the ring as garland. Crown a winner of each game!
