



Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



During the season of Lent, I was blessed to be able to collaborate with several of my colleagues in ministry as we worked to create an online Lenten series called "Created for Community." Emanuel and seven other churches worked to put together weekly worship services, each focusing on how we are in community. We looked at being in Community with creation, with the saints, with our neighbors, with those on the margins, and with Christ. I enjoyed this joint project and it was nice to work with some pastors and churches I have not worked with before. During the past month, I have thought a lot about what this theme means in the time when we have passed one year of the pandemic and as we move towards a more "normal life."

For many of us during this past year, our communities have looked very different. For some of us those communities have gotten smaller (or at least felt smaller). For some of us those communities have moved mostly online. And for some our communities have expanded to include neighbors we may otherwise not have stopped to talk to if we were continuing on with our very busy lives. Additionally, our worshipping community has changed. Since last March, all of our worship services have been online. This has allowed for people all over the world to hear the word of God, sing songs of praise and be lifted up in prayer—and our community has grown. However, for those who are used to sitting with their brothers and sisters in Christ, for those who are refreshed and recharged by seeing each other in person, this has been a time when our community seems to have shrunken.

One of our members recently commented on how we know that God is with us wherever we are but when we are together we are bolstered for wherever God may be calling us next. I have seen that and felt that during our in-person worship these past few weeks. I know that some of you are not yet comfortable being in a large group and some of you are not comfortable sitting outside, and that is just fine. We will continue to provide online worship into the future. But when we were gathered together, even with staggered seating, wearing masks, sitting outdoors, we were *still* community and we were there to lift each other up.

I pray in the coming months that the community of Emanuel Lutheran will continue to find strength in one another and strength in the Lord for whatever God may be calling us to next.

Greetings to all Emanuel Youth and Parents!

Thank you for having your kids join us for our online Sunday School lessons each week. This past month we have learned so much about God and faith.

- 1. In our March lesson "Where Does All the Money Go?" we learned that our offerings we give to our church, Emanuel, work in many different ways to tell people about Jesus. We are giving God back a small part of what He has given us. God can do great things with our offerings.

Holy Week

PALM SUNDAY ~ MARCH 28

Along with our online service, we will also be holding a parking lot worship service at 10:00 AM and will conclude the service with the procession of palms! Since we will be outdoors, if you would like to bring a large palm branch from your home for worship, please feel free to do so. We will also be passing out palm crosses that morning.

MAUNDY THURSDAY ~ APRIL 1

We will be celebrating this day with an online worship service which will include a stripping of the altar. It will be available on Facebook, YouTube and on our church website.

GOOD FRIDAY ~ APRIL 2

We will have two worship opportunities on Good Friday. Our online service will be available on our regular platforms all day and will feature the Passion of St. John with scripture readings and musical selections.

We will also have an in-person outdoor worship service Friday evening at 7:00 PM in the upper parking lot. This service will feature the Biblical Stations of the Cross as reinterpreted by Nicholas Markell (© 2013 Eyekons). We will start at the steps to Hope Center and then walk through the story leading up to Jesus' death with images located around the upper parking lot. This service cannot be experienced from your car and while we will have some chairs at each station, individuals will need to move themselves from station to station though the worship service. We will begin and end the service with song.



EASTER SUNDAY ~ APRIL 4

We will be celebrating the Risen Lord with an outdoor service in our <u>upper parking lot at 10:00 AM</u>. This service will be live-streamed on all of our digital platforms. Along with a children's message, special music and shouts of "Christ is Risen!" we will also be celebrating communion at the service. We pray that you will be able to participate in-person or online.

FLOWERS NEEDED

We will be decorating the outside cross on Saturday, April 3, in preparation for Easter. If you have garden flowers (especially lilies) to share with Emanuel, we welcome them and ask that you bring them to Emanuel by 8:30 AM that Saturday morning and they will be incorporated into the beauty of our cross.



SCHOPPA SCHOLARSHIPS



The Elroy Schoppa Scholarship Fund is provided by Emanuel Lutheran Church for members of Emanuel who are, or will be, attending an accredited college or vocational school in the next academic year. Students must attend 50% of Sunday Worship services and scheduled Youth meetings for at least 2 years within 4 years of applying. They must also maintain a 2.5 minimum GPA. In-Person Outdoor Worship Every Sunday

The church council has determined it to be reasonably safe for Emanuel to resume outdoor parking lot worship on Sundays at 10:00 AM. We will follow the previous format with people seated outdoors in chairs for a short in-person service of prayer, music, scripture, and homily. We will be practicing the usual safety protocols and are asking attendees to park in the lower lot by the classrooms and then walk to the registration table on the patio to check in. Then please continue to the upper parking lot where an usher will direct you and assist with a chair if needed. You are encouraged to bring your own chair or you may use one of the folding chairs from the church. If you would like to attend but wish to stay in your car, drive into the upper lot and an usher will direct you to a space designated for cars. Also, if you would like to sit in a chair but walking from the lower lot is a challenge, there will be limited parking in the upper lot available.

While we know this is still not "back to normal" we hope having a short time of worshipping together again will strengthen you for the days ahead.

Our studies come out of the *Gather Magazine*, a magazine from the Women of the ELCA. If you do not have a subscription to this magazine, we can email you a digital copy of the lesson.

Angels are not a major focus of holy Scripture, nor are they ever mentioned in our Christian creeds. Yet they show up with frequency and at pivotal moments in both Old and New Testaments. Church reformer Martin Luther is quoted as saying, "If you picture the Bible to be a mighty tree and every word a little branch, I have shaken every one of these branches because I wanted to know what it was and what it meant." SUNRISE SURPRISE


The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- 2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- 4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- 6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center just like Jesus' empty tomb!
