Dear Friends in Christ,

It's been a whirlwind couple of weeks since I sent Lorrie last month's newsletter article. I'm now settled in my apartment in Fullerton (kind of!) and in my study in Emanuel. As I shared with the Council at the end of my first day here . . . I couldn't be more grateful for all the ways Lorrie and Emanuel members have welcomed me and made me feel so at home. What a loving community of faith. I'm genuinely excited to share ministry with you!

At Wednesday morning's Bible study, I asked if anyone had questions for me. One of the first questions was, "So . . . what are you going to do with us?" We keep our focus on God's loving presence and faithful providing! We live generously. We set aside our own agendas to discern God's. We encourage ourselves and one another to have open minds, open hearts and open wills. When we might feel anxious, ...this year of transition is about us spending time together discovering and exploring and trying new things and failing and learning from all of it!

instead of trying to replicate what was or what we think we remember was 'normal', let's commit to cultivating wonder and curiosity. When something feels a little (or a lot uncomfortable), instead of reacting, let's slow down and ask, "What new thing might God be doing in and through this experience?"

I look forward to all we're going to learn in this journey as we pray and work and listen together for God's leading and as we 'live into' God's plan for Emanuel's future,

Many of us have truly missed our community in-person outreach during the pandemic. Even so, we have provided food to Storehouse Ministries/LRCC and provided gift cards to HIS House, WINGS, and Mama Hill's House to provide food and necessities.

We have had the wonderful opportunity to assist the Luther Glen Farm in their recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. Generous Emanuel members made a special offering of **<u>\$935.00</u>**!

The COVID-19 pandemic has allowed us to think and pray about our outreach ministries. Several will continue, and a few may be changed or added. One of the areas discussed was to increase our outreach from the local area to our brothers and sisters farther away. In the past, Emanuel has supported the Kulpahar Cristian School in India. There is an opportunity there now to reach out. There is also an opportunity in another country to help provide water facilities via a well. We are looking at those possibilities. In the short term, we will be supporting VBS, Study Buddies, collecting used eyeglasses through the Lions, providing Bibles for



the preschool children, putting together the Thanksgiving bags for Patriots and Paws, and of course, the Angel Tree at Christmas for WINGS and His House.

The Blue Emanuel bags with our logo are back! If you need one for yourself or to share with a friend, they are available in Moerer Hall. We will also use them for other projects coming up. Stay tuned for all of the specific and exciting opportunities!

In addition to supporting our community ministries, let's consider how else we can be good friends and neighbors. Hearts reach out too! Here are some thoughts on how to become a friend and nurture a good friendship.

BE KIND. This most basic behavior emphasized during childhood remains the core of successful adult relationships. Think of friendship as an emotional bank account. Every act of kindness and every expression of gratitude are deposits into this account, while criticism and negativity draw down the account.

• Listen up. Ask what's going on in your friends' lives. Let the other person know you are paying close attention through eye contact, body language, and occasional brief comments such as, "That sounds fun." When friends share details of hard times or difficult experiences, be empathetic, but don't give advice unless your friends ask for it.

- **Open up.** Build intimacy with your friends by opening up about yourself. Being willing to disclose personal experiences and concerns shows that your friend holds a special place in your life and deepens your connection.
- Show that you can be trusted. Being responsible, reliable and dependable is key to forming strong friendships. Keep your engagements and arrive on time. Follow through on commitments you've made to your friends. When your friends share confidential information, keep it private.
- **Make yourself available.** Building a close friendship takes time—together. Make an effort to see new friends regularly and to check in with them in between meet-ups. You may feel awkward the first few times you talk on the phone or get together, but this feeling is likely to pass as you get more comfortable with each other.

Greetings to all Emanuel Youth and Parents!

This past month we have learned so much about Jesus and the Bible.

- 1. "Why did God make the sky blue not green?" God could have picked any color for the sky and blue was just how God wanted it. God knew what he was doing when he made the flowers, fruits, trees, and everything. Psalm 19:1 says, "The heavens tell the glory of God, and the skies announce what his hands have made." That is some colorful announcement!
- 2. "How can Jesus live in my heart?" As we grow learning about Jesus, he will help us to share his love with other people. Jesus says, "Remain in me, and I will remain in you. - 3. "Fishers of People: A Mime" Our guest during this lesson was Luke Ospital as Mr. Fisherman the Mime. Since some of Jesus' first disciples were fishermen, Mr. Fisherman helped us learn more about fishing and how we can fish for people as the disciples did. After looking at all the bait items in his tackle box, there was only one bait that would help fish for people and that was the CROSS! God uses the cross to bring people to Jesus. God loves us so much that he sent his only Son to come to earth to teach us all about God. When we tell others that Jesus loves us they'll want to get caught (learn more) and we'll be fishers of people, too!
- 4. Finally, in the lesson "What does it mean when I'm supposed to turn the other cheek?" we discovered that Jesus said, "If someone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other cheek also." (Matthew 5:39). Jesus said it's more important to love and pray for our enemies and by doing so it's like we are turning the other cheek. God will help us through tough situations. At church, we have put heart stickers on the "Kid's Cart" in the Sanctuary for our kids to take one and remember to be kind even to people who don't treat us well.
