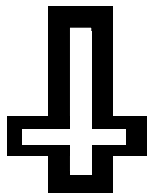

What do YOU see – Abundance or Scarcity ??

In worship yesterday we talked about Jesus miraculously feeding more than 5,000 people with 5 small biscuits and 2 tiny fish. It is the only story shared in all 4 gospels. Each of the gospel accounts includes and emphasizes different details. Yesterday we focused on John 6:1-15. Slightly different accounts are in Matthew 14:13-21, Mark 6:30-44 and Luke 9:10-17.

In all the accounts, Jesus' disciples are exhausted and overwhelmed. They're in a deserted place, surrounded by hungry crowds of people waiting to see and hear Jesus, wanting comfort, healing, and demanding the disciples' attention. Who could blame the disciples for suggesting that Jesus send the crowds away? They look around and all they see is scarcity. Sure . . . they have a little boy's lunch. But what is that in the face of so much need? In Matthew, Mark and Luke, that's when Jesus says to them, "*Bring what you have to me!*"

There, in the wilderness, in a deserted, seemingly lifeless place, God creates a place of plenty, a place of abundance. Jesus looks up to heaven, blesses and breaks the loaves and gives them to the disciples. And out of what seemed so little, there is food for the hungry thousands, healing for people struggling in mind, body and spirit. The crowd sits and eats until they are full and there are even leftovers . . . enough to fill 12 baskets.

How often you and I are like those disciples! We are tired. Overwhelmed. Certain that whatever resources we have — time, patience, money, or talent — it is NOT enough to meet the challenge before us. Sometimes we've become so used to doing it all by ourselves, that we forget how God wants to strengthen the body by having us work together! How quickly we can get paralyzed or defeated by our limited perspective. And how easily we forget that Jesus is beside us and longing to help and partner with us.

Despite how often we may be tempted to try, none of us can single-handedly lead Emanuel's worship or ministries. Alone, we can't feed the hungry or house the homeless. But when we all faithfully and generously bring our meager offerings of time, talents and resources to God, they are multiplied beyond what we could ever ask or imagine. Doesn't that happen every time we gather in worship, with God using all our meager gifts to make our worship together more than any of us could do alone?

How many hearts were touched as the Holy Spirit led little Olivia to play maracas with the Praise Band or as Melissa, visiting from Arizona, helped lead vocals? How many veterans will be blessed because a handful of people will share 90 minutes of their morning July 31 to drive a truck or help load and unload furniture and household items we're donating to Patriots and Paws?

God has entrusted Emanuel's ministries to all of us. It may be tempting to stay on the sidelines, allow others to lead the way, sure that we don't have enough time, enough money, enough volunteers, enough resources to make a difference. But imagine what we'd miss. We'd miss seeing God bless others through us. We miss *being* God's miracles.

With Jesus we are blessed with abundance. With life and breath. With love overflowing. With forgiveness to share. Jesus says, "*Bring what you have to me!*" He doesn't say bring some of it. He simply says, "*Bring what you DO have.*" And then Jesus blesses it. He gives thanks. And in Jesus' hands our offering — whatever the size — is multiplied and shared with all. What amazing and miraculous generosity!

FROM THE BOARD OF PARISH EDUCATION

Greetings to all Emanuel Youth and Parents!

This past month we have learned so much about Jesus and the Bible.

1. In our lesson about “Bubbles” we saw that bubbles are fun and pretty with iridescent colors. But they just don’t last! The Bible says that nothing on earth will last forever. The grass and flowers may last longer than a bubble, but after a while they die too. Only God’s Word will last forever (Isaiah 4:8).
2. Maggie and Sadie Diaz told us the parable of the “Rich Fool.” The rich fool had enough good things stored for many years for himself. God wants us to show concern for others and not just be thinking of ourselves. Jesus knew all about sharing. Jesus shared His love, His power, and finally He gave away His life on a cross for us.
3. “Why should I Read the Bible?” All the food we need to feel better and to grow is in the Bible. If we never open it, never read it, and never get our spiritual food, we’ll go on feeling empty. Food, like peanut butter, satisfies our physical needs when we are hungry. Just as food gives us nutrition for our bodies, reading the Bible gives us spiritual nutrition. God’s Word is important for our spiritual life as food is to our physical life.
4. Our guest during this lesson was Jack Ospital. He helped us figure out, “How do you close a banana?” Once a banana is peeled there is a problem if you don’t want to eat the whole banana. Jack tried different ways to close up a banana so it wouldn’t turn brown and mushy later. Once a banana is open you can’t put it back together. There are things in life like that too. If you say an angry word to someone you can’t take it back. God knows we can’t take back the wrong things we’ve done (sin) so He forgives us. We can ask God to forgive us and then enjoy the beautiful world God has made.

After much thought and planning, Parish Ed has decided to not hold our one-day VBS Day Camp in August due to the elevated COVID numbers in both L.A. and Orange counties. Thank you for returning your surveys. Your input is important to us and we will use this information as we plan programs for our youth in the months ahead.

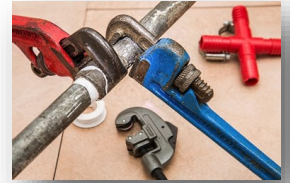
A special thank you goes to Ricki Fehr as she is editing our weekly Sunday School lessons and getting them ready for online viewing.

And A BIG THANK YOU for our “A” Team of volunteers, who use their time and skills to fix things whenever possible as a gift to Emanuel and to God.

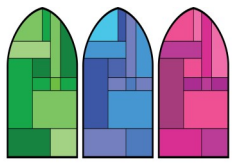

UPDATED WORSHIP NEWS

Emanuel's Church Council continues to prayerfully balance congregational safety with a desire to make worship as accessible and enjoyable as possible for everyone.

◆ **Starting Sunday, August 1*, the following guidelines will be in place for INDOOR worship:**

- Masks optional; the congregation is asked to wear masks if they should. (We trust you will know if you should.)
- The congregation is encouraged NOT to sing without wearing a mask.
- Everyone is encouraged to practice social distancing.


Prayers of Thanksgiving — We Are Blessed to Be A Blessing

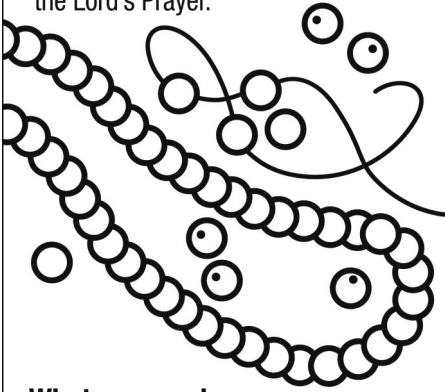

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:

1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - **blue** = the Father
 - **white** = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
 - **red** = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - **black** = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver
