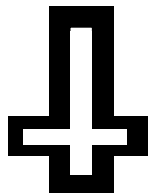

How might YOU grow in faith this Fall??

A Fall Challenge for Prayerful Reflection

As the end of summer approaches, our schedules change, children go back to school, and each of us has an opportunity to look at the choices we have made and how we want to live into this Fall. Covid remains a concern and all of us have responded differently to the desire to resume a more “normal” life after Covid. The cost of living has certainly changed a great deal. Housing, groceries, utilities and gas are all taking a bigger bite of our finances. Emanuel’s costs have risen as well, especially for utilities; at the same time attendance, volunteer time and giving have declined. Church Mutual, Emanuel’s insurance carrier, recently conducted a survey of many churches and the results are sobering ... *Between 2019 and 2021, total financial giving decreased by 43.3% and total attendance decreased by 74%*. Sadly, we have experienced some of that shift here at Emanuel over the last couple years.

As Fall begins this month, we encourage you to prayerfully consider the importance of your relationship with God and with your siblings in Christ here at Emanuel. Together, we ARE the body of Christ. Together, we share joys and sorrows. Together, we encourage one another and help each other grow in faith and service. And it is together, to each one of us, that God has entrusted Emanuel’s ministry.

How might God be calling YOU to deeper faith and to faithful living as an important part of God’s family here at Emanuel this Fall??

To begin, please consider returning in person to worship. We realize this is not possible for all, but worshiping God together and being in the midst of fellow believers is powerful! Hebrews 10:25 encourages us *“not to give up meeting together...but let us encourage one another”*. Lifting our voices to the Lord in song, communing and praying together as God’s family are important. So is seeing one another in person, and sharing coffee and fellowship. How will the little ones know they are a part of God’s family if they don’t see and interact with *the rest of the family*? How do we share the love of God and teach it to our children if we don’t practice it with each other? Our kids and grandkids, even our neighbors, are watching us to see what’s important by what we make time for. The decline in worship attendance is universal, but it is not good. Help us reverse the trend!!

Secondly, commit to serving God alongside your church family. Relationships grow when we join together in serving God and our neighbor. This was evident when we saw teens reconnecting with each other and with caring adults as they volunteered with VBS last month. Several opportunities are coming up where lots of bags and backpacks will be filled and packed for victims of trafficking, for the homeless and for young people aging out of the foster system. Make a commitment now to be part of these projects to reconnect with your Emanuel family as well as actively show God’s love to those we do not know. You will be blessed as you bless others!

And lastly, please help to financially support Emanuel. Emanuel’s ministries depend on the generous support of each one of us; there are no other sources of income. Someone once said *“we can’t outgive God!”* It’s true; especially when we consider Jesus’ death on the cross. How important is God’s grace and mercy to us individually? When times are tough we are often tempted to cut back on our giving, but giving to God is not the same as paying a bill. All that we have is God’s gift to us. What we give back to God is our faithful response to God’s generosity and blessing. Where and how we spend our money IS a reflection of what is important to us. How is your faith life reflected in your giving? Let’s all experience the joy of giving by stepping out in faith to do so!

Please commit to growing in faith this Fall as well as growing in your relationship with God and with your family here at Emanuel. Join us in worship, in serving and in generously supporting Emanuel as we seek to live and to share God’s love with others. Emanuel – God IS with us. May we all grow in faith TOGETHER!

REACHING OUT IN OUR OWN LA HABRA COMMUNITY

On August 6, HAHO had discussions and prayers regarding how we might reach out to our neighbors and have an impact within our local community. That very day, Sharon Frazier met Mayor Jose Medrano of La Habra and asked if they had a need we could help with. He was thrilled and let her know that human trafficking was more prevalent in La Habra and they were working diligently to end this and help them be free. He suggested an important aspect would be providing a backpack with personal items to help them start a new life. That was an answer to prayer and an opportunity for us to immediately make an impact. We will be purchasing the backpacks and the suggested items and will present them through the La Habra Police and L A County Sheriff’s office. Mayor Medrano whose “day job” is in law enforcement is very committed to ending trafficking. Emanuel will now be able to assist our community members in this process and make our community better.

Join Joy Circle in Moerer Hall for our NEW Fall Bible study
Jesus and Nature: Teachers of Faith

Jesus often turned to the natural world in teaching, opening our eyes to see creation not just as something to be cared for, but as our teacher and kindred. It is no mistake that Jesus, who lovingly spoke of soil and plants, was thought to be a gardener that first Easter morning. This three-session Bible study will shift our perspectives and allow nature to be our teacher, through the words of Jesus and other parts of Scripture. The trees, the soil and the creatures will offer us new perspectives on the character of God and challenge us to deepen our stewardship of God's precious creation. Our study uses the Bible study offered in Gather Magazine, the ELCA magazine for women.

September 19 "Trees"

Tap into Biblical images of trees and explore why planting and protecting trees is important, while rooting us in models of interdependence and mutuality.

October 17 "Soil"

Dig deeply into the parable of the soil (Matthew 13) and other Biblical accounts that relate to care for this part of creation, while looking at models of growth that involve wholeness and wellness.

November 21 "Creatures"

Observe and learn about God from birds, foxes, sheep, dogs and other animals, while considering habitat protection, food justice and the model of trust.

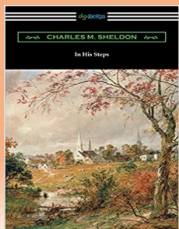
