



Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



On Sunday, April 12, in a special congregational meeting, the good people of Emanuel voted to amend our upcoming budget and welcome a seminary intern into our congregation. Having watched the way this congregation has welcomed, supported and formed Vicar Maria these past nine months makes me excited to see what we will do next as this ministry unfolds. Our new intern, Matt Polsdofer, will be moving out to California shortly and will be officially welcomed and commissioned at worship on Sunday, June 16. To read more about him and his family who will also be part of Emanuel, please read his welcome letter on page 8.

One notable difference between this internship and the previous ones Emanuel has been a part of is that Matt will be with us for two years. I explained this in some detail at the congregational meeting but for those who were unable to attend Matt is part of a new pilot program for Master's of Divinity Students at Luther Seminary called MDivX.

In July 2018, Luther Seminary received a large financial gift to fund a pilot program for an accelerated Master of Divinity program, MDivX. This program allows students who are gifted in areas of ministry to complete the full 30-course MDiv program from Luther Seminary in 24 months by participating in year-round classes and completing concurrent part-time ministry work at congregational sites like Emanuel. Luther Seminary has been looking to the future of education and for nearly a decade has put a strong focus on distributive learning so students are able to complete their class work via online classes, video group classes and intensive on-campus classes.

Matt will be with us from June 2019-2021 working as an intern at Emanuel, learning and leading as past interns have, on a half-time basis. The other half of his time he will be engaging in seminary classes, mostly online with occasional travel back to St. Paul, MN for intensive classes. Because of Matt's background in congregational ministry (see his welcome letter p.8) there are many skills and gifts for professional ministry that he will bring to Emanuel.

I am excited to see where we as a congregation will go in the coming two years and am thrilled to know that it will include the ministry to which God has called us, training future leaders of the church.

When I was in Confirmation, I remember preparing for Confirmation Sunday. In order to be confirmed, we needed to sign up for an appointment with one of the Pastors to have a conversation, a sort of defense for our faith. I remembered thinking that I needed to have all of the right answers. And I was nervous that if I said something wrong, my Pastors had the authority to not confirm me. Little did I know, it wasn't up to them if I was confirmed or not. It was up to me. Did I want to continue in a life of faith? In a life of questions about who God is and what God is doing in our world?

This month on May 19, we will be celebrating with five students who have completed two years in confirmation instruction. We will ask them to affirm the promises made to them in their baptisms and profess their faith. We mark this day by calling it Confirmation Sunday. And we celebrate the end of their two year faith formation coursework. Although it is an end, it is most certainly a beginning.

Throughout their two-year faith formation, these students have asked questions, read the Bible, learned about Lutheran history and tradition, and hopefully had a little fun. Together we have learned that faith is not something that is a 'one and done.' Rather, faith is a lifelong journey. It is a daily dying and rising in Christ. Which is where the Baptism or Affirmation of Baptism part comes in.

In Paul's letter to the Romans, he writes about baptism, "Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4). In our hymnal the ELW, Affirmation of Baptism is defined like this:

Affirmation of Baptism may be used at many times in the life of a baptized Christian. It is especially appropriate as part of a process of formation in faith in youth or adulthood (confirmation), at the time of beginning one's participation in a community of faith, as a sign of renewed participation in the life of the church, or at the time of a significant life passage.

Namely, the Affirmation of Baptism, is a new life with a promise to continue asking questions of faith. It is a new life with a declaration to continue studying God's Word, and the world around us, asking questions and being in community with others. It is a new life with a vow to show up for your friends, family, and those in need here and throughout the world. It is a new life with a pledge to be a mirror to other Christians when we are not being Christ's light in the world.

Each day, we are **ALL** invited

- To proclaim our faith in the Triune God
- To renounce the forces of evil found in this world, the ways of sin that draw us away from relationship with God and with one another
- To ask questions and to wonder about the things of God
- To serve the world with humility and with our God given gifts

Confirmation is not one and done, but rather a way to live everyday strengthened by faith in the promises of God through Jesus Christ to live, empowered by the Holy Spirit to share God's love with the whole world!

COMMUNITY SHARING AND CARING OUTREACH:

BIG NEWS! HAHO member Janine Ward has worked with Thrivent to obtain a \$3,500 grant for community outreach! This grant will be used by Emanuel members working together to reach those in need. Currently the plan is to have a work party to put together the Thanksgiving bags for Patriots and Paws, with Emanuel members donating only the gift cards. The groceries would be included in the grant. We will also provide needed items for families in transition at HIS House, a ministry in Placentia that both Emanuel and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints recently collaborated on as Women of Faith where we made and donated 25 blankets. We are so excited for this opportunity. Thrivent is well aware of Emanuel’s ongoing outreach and approached us with this amazing grant to share.

FRISTERS: 3,218 Diapers and 6,452 Wipes were delivered to Fristers on April 4. This is an amazing gift that enables the caretakers to properly care for the children while the moms are meeting weekly. Thank you for your generous help! (See picture to the right.)

STUDY BUDDIES: Due to a generous grant of TWO Thrivent Action Team Cards, applied for by two Emanuel Thrivent members, Study Buddies has received a new laptop to assist the students with their online homework along with some snacks and rewards for the students. HAHO contributions help to support this process to encourage these young learners from our community. Proceeds from the Black Bear Fundraiser on April 29 will also go to the Study Buddies ministry.




