THE FULLNESS OF TIME

I am writing this article on April 22, and for my household this marks 40 days of living in the time of COVID-19 quarantine. I received a message board with moveable letters from my brother and sisterin-law for my birthday this year. Normally it sits in our entry way and contains messages of wit and witticism that delight all who read it (or at least gives me a chuckle), but for the last 40 days our message board has keep track of how long we have been in what my husband deemed "Coronaville."



Today during our Wednesday morning Zoom Bible Study (all are welcome to attend, email vicar@elclh.org to get the link) we were looking at the story in the beginning of Matthew when Jesus is tempted in the wilderness for...40 days! I thought it was fitting that according to when I started my countdown calendar, today was also the 40th day of my time in the wilderness.

We discussed the different places in our scripture where 40 is used to mark the passage of time in days or years—Moses on Mt. Saini for 40 days, the Israelites wondering in the wilderness for 40 years looking for the promised land, and for the prophet Elijah on the run from queen Jezebel for 40 days and 40 nights. I told the class that in Biblical literature, the number forty doesn't necessarily mark 40 actual days or years but instead it is a number used to represent "the fullness of time." In other words, the amount of time needed to be complete, or to be fulfilled. It's a little like saying "we'll be done when we are done."

I have been thinking about this concept a lot today. We are people driven by our calendars and schedules and knowing when something starts and how long it will take. But we are now in a time when the future schedule is unknown. When will life return to normal? When can we come back? When will this all be over? I think we will be in a quarantined life, a slowed down life, a distanced life for the fullness of time. I do not know how many days, weeks or months that will be, but if the Biblical stories have taught me anything, it's that when God's people are led through a time of trial, they will persevere. They might not be the same, we might not be the same. But having lived through the "fullness of time" that our quarantine will take, we too are living out part of our Biblical story as people who have been tested, who trusted in God's guidance, and people who continue to radiate the light of Christ into dark places.

I don't know about you, but recently I haven't felt too motivated. I know, I know, maybe Matt's motivational minute may not have been the best title for my newsletter articles, but who knew what would happen? I find myself going through the 5 stages of grief (denial, anger, bargaining, depression & acceptance) with what is happening with our "new normal" and sometimes these 5 stages all are happening at once. I'm finding Biblical stories jumping off the page during this time. Stories about being exiled or isolated have never been more relatable or spoken to me as much as during this time. I also have always wondered about the various Psalms. In most Psalms (or at least to me) it feels like they go through a lot of emotions while talking to God. One moment they are upset and angry with God, but a line later they are talking about the reassurance they have in God and how they know that their God has always been there. It never made sense to me, but during this "new normal" time I am realizing I am in company with the Psalmists. One moment I am angry at God and wanting to just leave my house or be able to do something, and other moments I am so thankful for everything God's given to me.

One of the questions we often ask our children is "how is your heart feeling"? I don't know how your heart is feeling right now, maybe you are like me and go from angry to thankfulness, maybe you are super happy or maybe you are super sad or maybe somewhere in between. Whatever is going on in your life and whatever you are feeling, please know that God is there to listen to you. You are also in great company because there are several stories in the Bible with various people and various emotions. We often hear about the ones where people go from upset to happy with God, but there is the full range of emotions in the Bible. I think of the book of Lamentations where there is so much sorrow and pondering of the age-old question, "What is the point of life"?

Whatever you are going through, please know that you are not alone. As Bishop Taylor was talking about in his sermon the Sunday after Easter, Jesus is with you in whatever is going on in your life. Also, please know that Pastor Cate and I are here for you. We have been making calls to contact every member household. One of the things we've been asking each household is if there is anything you would like us to pray for. We are here for you and we are glad to pray for you and any specific requests you have. In the middle of all the chaos in life, please know that we are taking time to pray for you all.

- 1. Sew pom-poms together to make a caterpillar body. Tie off that string.
