



I try to get out into the community, the neighborhood around Emanuel as often as possible. It's a rare day that I'm not blessed by the people I meet . . .


Having breakfast this morning at John's Restaurant, just around the corner from Emanuel, I met Dave. I'd never met Dave before, but we made eye contact as he placed his order and walked past me with the shopping bags he carried. When he went back to get his food, I smiled and he stopped at my table to talk. Today was his mother's birthday. As I invited him to tell me about her, his face was filled with light and love and I couldn't help thinking God was visiting with me in presence of this sweet, gentle man. Like the travelers on the road to Emmaus, my heart burned within me . . . with God's warmth, love, light, and grace that Dave embodied. He didn't know I was a pastor, but tenderly shared his faith with me . . . told me about his mom Ruth who died 11 years ago and their dog Suzy, who Dave was sure was a guardian angel God sent to comfort and watch over them both when his dad died. I can hardly put into words how God blessed me through Dave. I'm so very thankful I set my pen down, stopped writing and was simply and fully present with Dave as we talked. It was a holy moment. And I have no doubt it was God who stopped at my table and changed my morning and my week through that encounter!

Beside meeting Dave, I've seen God at work in this past week in so many ways . . . in the installation of our new Bishop Dave Nagler and the new leaders called to be part of our Pacifica Office of the Bishop, in learning and social time with colleagues at our Synod Leadership Conference that followed. God was powerfully present as I met with the family of 96 year old Eileen "Nana" Curwood to plan her Celebration of Life this Saturday and through the Prayer Team as we have continued to pray with and for so many others in our congregation and our community with so many needs. God has been present in the laughter and joy of having so many neighbors join us for Trunk or Treat and in the many service projects we've undertaken for foster kids and victims of human trafficking. And, dear friends, I especially give thanks for all the ways God continues to make God's self known in the conversations and connections we've experienced in Emanuel's Every Member Check-In Calls. Thank you to the team helping us try and reach every member of Emanuel with a call to simply check in and help everyone at Emanuel know they matter to God and to us. If you haven't had a call, maybe we don't have current contact information. Please reach out to the church office. We want to be sure YOU know you're loved . . . by God AND by your siblings in Christ here at Emanuel.






