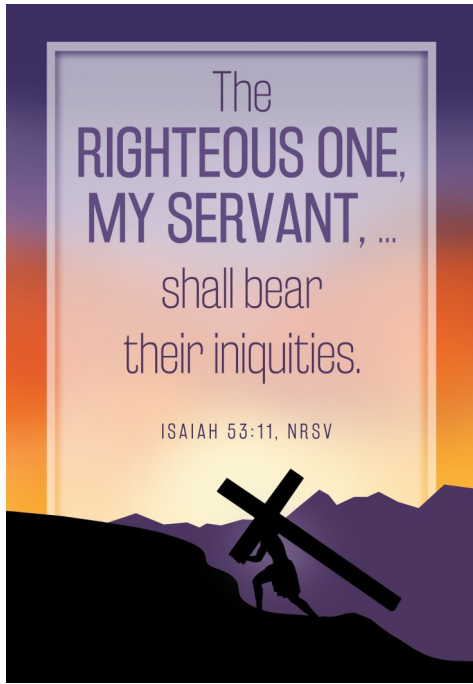

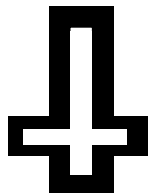

Ashes, Lent & Mid-Week Worship

Joel 2:13 says “rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love”.

On Ash Wednesday (March 2) we begin Lent, a season of 40 days leading up to Easter (not counting Sundays). Lent begins with a special day of repentance on Ash Wednesday, and ends with the solemnity of Good Friday, the day of Jesus’ crucifixion. In between, Lent calls us to the disciplines of self-examination and repentance, prayer and self-denial, not as something to be observed by others, but as a sincere expression of our desire to live and act in accord with God’s will. Through prayer and self-examination, Lent is a holy time, a time “set apart” for us to confess our total inadequacy before God, to

be emptied of our false pride, a time to confess our desperate need for God’s grace and mercy.

As part of our worship on Ash Wednesday, we come before God, literally in ashes, in humble confession of our sins. Those worshipping in person will be invited forward to receive ashes on their forehead or back of the hand in the shape of the cross. The ashes serve as a physical reminder of our sin, our frailty and our total dependence upon God for life. The ashes are also a sign of cleansing and renewal. Ashes, often used as a cleansing agent in the absence of soap, became a sign of God’s forgiveness and renewal as we place our needs our fears, our failures, our hopes and our very lives in God’s hands again.

As Christians, we are always in the process of becoming disciples and rediscovering what God wants us to do and to be. The 40-day season of Lent is an ideal time for encouraging that process. Just as Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness preparing for his ministry, the 40 days of Lent are intended to be 40 days for us to prepare for our ministry as Christ’s disciples.

As Emanuel prepares to call a new pastor later this year, our focus during mid-week (Wednesday) worship this year will be centered on Rediscovering God’s Mission and Vision. After exploring Emanuel’s History and Heritage and learning more about “Who we are”, now we turn our attention to God’s mission and vision for Emanuel and reflecting on “What is God calling Emanuel to do and to be?”

PLEASE take time during the 40 days of Lent to whole-heartedly “Return to the Lord”. Make Sunday worship a priority. Join our mid-week worship services on Zoom (see details below). Pray. Read and study the Bible. Meditate on what it means that Jesus died for YOUR sins. And then share that experience with others, not to impress them, but because it helps all of us come to a new appreciation and experience of how much we are loved by God!

May this year’s 40 day Lenten journey lead us to the cross, to the arms of Christ, to the center of Christian community where we will together experience the healing and wholeness God knows we all need so that we might SHARE the Good News with a weary world.

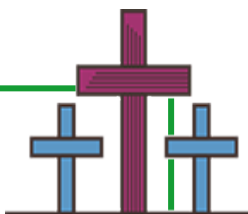

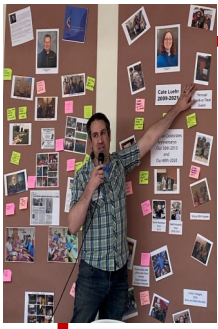
Revive an OLD tradition in a NEW way:

1. What brought you to Emanuel:

- Felt welcome** – Warm welcome from church family, loved pastors, felt comfortable
- Through family** - parents' or grandparents' involvement, through marriage,
- Involvement in ministry or looking for a church** - piano lessons, BSF Dinner and study

2. What keeps you at Emanuel:

- People** - whether is it blood/multi-generational families or friends/relationships individuals find a sense of community at Emanuel
- Worship/Music and religious teaching** are important, also pastors tapping into the talents of individuals or pushing someone out of their comfort zone
- Being able to make a meaningful contribution** through various programs including Study Buddies, prayer group and the mentor program, etc.

3. What did it take/ when did you feel like you "belonged" here:

- Welcoming nature from the beginning** - no judgment, "no one asked us to leave" appreciated for our efforts, upon marriage and transition from another faith, sincerity of our people – genuine acceptance, accommodating new cultures, patience with crying children
- When I was asked personally to get involved/lead something** - asked to join the church, chair/serve on/help with Internship committee, Stephen Ministry, Social Media, HAHO, VBS, Study Buddies, be in a play, was given jobs around the church
- Being involved** - Sunday School, Youth Groups, serving turkey at the Thanksgiving dinner, Agape, prayer group, reading on Sunday, Stephen Ministry

4. How might we make Emanuel Stronger :

- Community Outreach** -More involvement in community, events, outreach programs advertisements geared to youth and families
- Campus presence** –Visibility in community, flyers, newspaper column
- Activities** – Small groups bring people together, develop our youth program participation beyond worship

5. How will we partner with our new pastor, what will we commit to our new pastor?

- Be supportive-** Offer the same hospitality that we offer our vicars, be welcoming involved with activities, open-minded, willing to try new things
- Attend worship** - Listen to him/her, see what they have to offer, notice how God might be doing a new thing in and through us
- Pray for him/her,** serve together in sharing the good news

WINGS Shelter :

With the \$1000 Matthew 25 Grant from the Pacifica Synod, we have purchased sweat shirts and sweat pants for the residents of the WINGS Shelter. By ordering directly from Hanes, we were able to purchase 30 sets of sweatshirts and sweatpants for women and 15 sets of sweatshirts and sweatpants for children for a total cost of \$1051.20. This was almost a 60% discount from the retail cost. We are so grateful to the Pacifica Synod for this grant!

YWCA – WINGS (Women in Need Growing Strong) Domestic Violence program began in 1979 and operates the second largest domestic violence shelter in Los Angeles County. WINGS' goal is to help domestic violence victims and their dependent children move out of crisis and toward safety and autonomy. They offer the community: Professional & legal assistance, Emergency Shelter, Case Management, Support groups, Educational workshops, Job development skills, Transitional Housing and Rental assistance, Youth & Teen services.

LHCRCC:

HAHO encourages you to continue to contribute non-perishable food items to the carts in the narthex, which are faithfully carried to the La Habra Community Resource Center Food Bank by Ricki Fehr every week. Ricki also volunteers there packing and distributing the food. Thanks, Ricki, and thanks to all of you who help provide food to our neighbors.

We continue to support our other Emanuel ministries, as Heart and Hands Outreach interacts with almost all of them, as well as our Community-based partner ministries, and will be working with Parish Ed. on a special community outreach for Easter. We invite everyone at Emanuel to let us know how we might reach out and love our neighbors and to participate in our HAHO team.



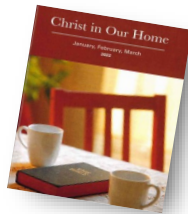



Washed clean



Make customized jelly soaps to banish dirt and grime.



What you need:

- 1 package unflavored gelatin
- ¾ cup very warm water
- 1 tsp salt
- ¾ cup gel body wash
- Food coloring
- Rubbing alcohol in spray bottle
- Silicone baking molds

What you do:

1. In a bowl, stir gelatin and warm water until dissolved.
2. Add salt, body wash and a few drops of food coloring. Stir.
3. Spray molds with rubbing alcohol (to prevent bubbles). Place molds on a tray.
4. Pour mixture into the molds. Refrigerate until set, about two hours.
5. Pop soap out of molds and store in an airtight container.
