

A NOTE PASTOR

Have you ever heard of Music Therapy? It is a professional field much like other helpful therapies for people needing to address an issue in life. It seems to be based heavily on the idea that people relate points in life to a musical piece. The music could be from any or every genre. It can be a piece that was heard once or was heard many times. It can be music that in some way has connected an event in a person's life. When it is heard by the person, there can be any number of reactions from feeling good to being sad or crying or having a moment of anger. Music Therapy is a fascinating concept. Over the years I have experienced the effects of a piece of music in such a way. It is certainly at the very least a starting point for discussion if that's the person's choice.

I believe there are numerous hymns and songs sung at a worship service that can elicit the same kinds of responses. With many, there can be a spiritual dimension that might not necessarily be a part of Music Therapy, although that too is a possibility. I believe we have feelings when a particular hymn or song is sung that touches our relationship to God. Actually, it's for this reason that hymnody and song has been such a significant part of worship for centuries.

Over the next few Sundays, be aware of the feelings you might have during a hymn or song. What feeling do you have? Do you recall the first time you heard the particular piece? Does it bring back good or sad memories? Do you take the hymn or song at face value as if it's never been a part of your life? I am not asking you to overanalyze a hymn or song. Perhaps being aware of the possibilities will enhance your hearing even more for a more fruitful worship service.

I'll conclude by including the third verse of "Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee." The music is from Beethoven's 9th Symphony. The words are by Henry van Dyke.

Thou art giving and forgiving, ever blessing, ever blest, well-spring of the joy of living, ocean-depth of happy rest! Thou our Father, Christ our brother, all who live in love are thine; teach us how to love each other, lift us to the joy divine!



This is an amazing outpouring of generosity toward the homeless in this community.

FOOD COLLECTION

HAHO will continue to collect food for distribution to seniors, young families and students in our area. We do this through working with First Lutheran in Fullerton. To update you on some changes to the list of needed items, there are new lists at the Welcome Table. They badly need cereal, canned corn, condiments and sauces, ONLY IN PLASTIC CONTAINERS. NO GLASS JARS PLEASE. For the time being, they are well stocked with pasta, rice and beans.

PATHWAYS OF HOPE

At January's meeting, it was decided that we will partner with Pathways of Hope, an organization serving the North Orange County area. We have chosen to help by seeking donations of different hygiene items each month for those families struggling, though housed, not homeless. More information will be given as each month we zero in on a specific request.

As always, we do not want to overwhelm you with requests. "PICK YOUR PASSION"! We ask that you give when and if you are able to the place where the Spirit leads you. And we thank each and every one of you who picks up a food item when you shop or respects the desire to be clean when the cost of shampoo is a hardship, or wants others to be warm! Giving is a gift to the giver as well as the receiver! We encourage you to join us or suggest outreach ideas at any time. Make this heartfelt craft as a decoration or gift.

What you need:

- Yarn
- Scissors
- Parchment paper
- Baking sheet
- · Heart-shaped cookie cutters
- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- ½ cup water
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
- Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
- Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
- Place yarn in the cookie cutters, allowing pieces to cross and loop within the heart. Add more until the cookie cutter is filled and the yarn looks like a heart.
- Remove cookie cutters and bake the sheet for two hours at 150°F, or until hearts are dry and hard.
